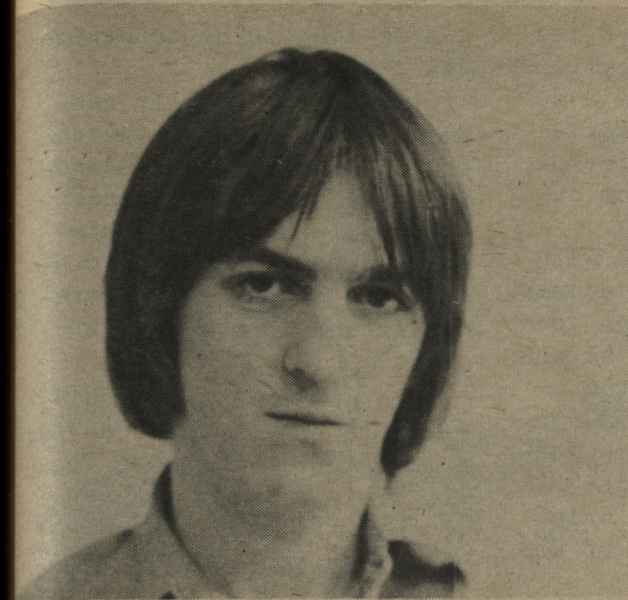


Vice-President

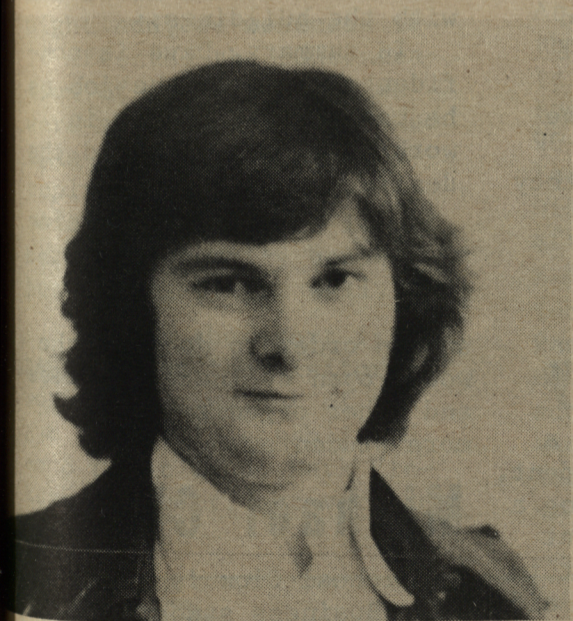
