# School Uniforms In New Zealand Are Under Attack

Canadian Press Correspondent AUCKLAND, N.Z. (CP)—School uniforms, almost universal in New Zealand schools, have been under attack. Education Minister R. M. Algie and many headmasters have defended the custom. The type of uniform often draws amazed comment from visitors, especially from North America. Girls wear "gym" frocks of heavy pleated material over white blouses, long black stockings, black shoes and straw hats with a band in the school colors. There is some variation in color and design, but this is the standard.

In summer the uniform is normally varied to a cotton frock of standard design and cut, and short socks. The boys' uniform is equally strange by North American standards. Normally it consists of a small cap perched on top of the head, a flannel shirt open at the neck, shorts of the same color as the shirt, stockings ending several inches below the knee, and black shoes.

Abolition of uniforms, he said, could easily result in added expense if parents and children were free to yield to a competitive spirit in dress.

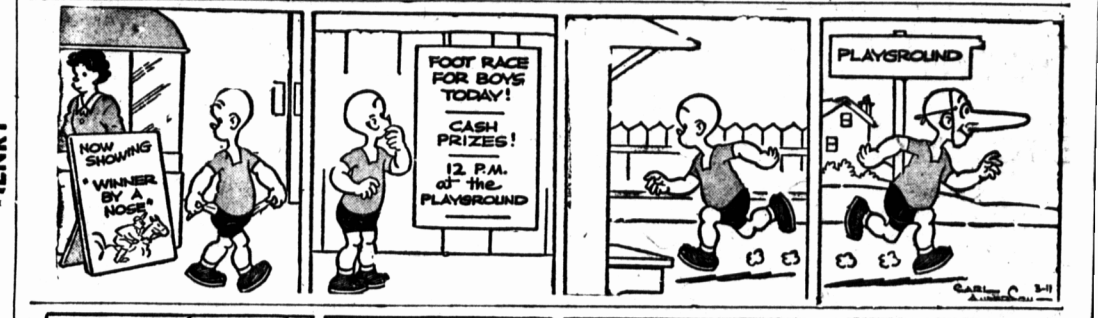
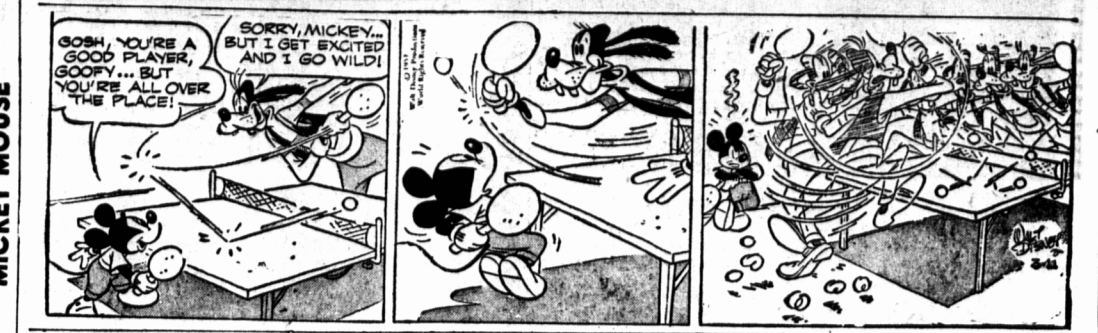
