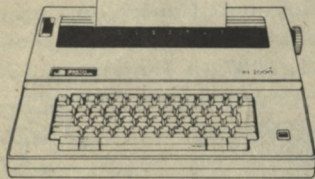
To be eligible, students must have passed at least eight three-semester hour courses in the previous year of study or, if first year students, satisfied the entrance requirements of the University.
