**SCHOOL BOARD** — The monthly meeting of the City School Board was held Monday afternoon with Dr. R. G. Lee in the chair. Major Baker reported on the meeting of a committee of the Board with the Mayor and City Council regarding the proposed High School. On account of the overcrowding of Prince Street School it is felt that the City will have to be zoned so far as new pupils entering these schools next September, and a suggested division of the City is by a line drawn through the center of the following streets, Elm Avenue and Great George Street to Fitzroy Street, along Fitzroy Street to Hillsborough, down Hillsborough Street to Grafton Street and East along that Street to City Limits. All new pupils north and east of that line to attend Prince Street School and all pupils living west or south of that line to attend West Kent School. Parents who intend to send pupils to grade one in those schools next September are requested to advise the Principals before the end of March. See advertisement in another column. Ruth

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** This is another in a series of studies from the Old Testament. The text is condensed from selections by Houston Harfe for the new book, "In Our Image," illustration by Guy Rowe is also from the book.

Now there was a famine in the land. And a certain man went to sojourn in Moab, he, Elimelech, and his wife Naomi, and his two sons Mahlon and Chilion. And each in the house of his husband. And her two sons took wives of the women of Moab; one was Orpah, and the other Ruth: and they dwelled there about ten years. An Mahlon and Chilion died also; and the woman was left of her two sons and her husband.

Then she arose to return unto the land of Judah. And Naomi said to her daughters-in-law, Go, return to her mother's house: for the Lord grant that ye may find rest. Then she kissed them; and they lifted up their voice, and wept. And Orpah kissed her mother in law; but Ruth clave unto her. And she said, Behold thy sister in law is gone back: return thou after thy sister in law. And Ruth said, In-treat me not to leave thee, or to return from following thee: for whither thou goest, I will go; and where thou lodgest, I will lodge: thy people shall be my people, and thy God my God: Where thou diest will I die, and there will I be buried: and there will I be buried: the Lord do so to me, and more also, if I ought but death part thee and me.

So they two went and came to Bethlehem in the beginning of barley harvest.

And Naomi had a kinsman of her husband's, a mighty man of wealth, and his name was Boaz. And Ruth the Moabitess said unto

Naomi, Let me now go and glean ears of corn after the reapers. And she said, Go, my daughter. And she went; and her hap was to light on the field belonging unto Boaz. And Boaz came, and said to his servant that was set over the reapers, Whose damsel is this? And the servant answered. It is the Moabitish damsel that came back with Naomi out of Moab. Then said Boaz unto Ruth, Hearst thou not, my daughter? Go not to glean in another field, but abide here fast by my maidens. So she gleaned in the field until even, and beat out that she had gleaned: and it was about an ephah of barley.

And she went into the city; and her mother in law said, Where hast thou gleaned to day? And she said, with Boaz. And Naomi said, Blessed be he of the Lord, who hath not left off his kindness to the living and to the dead.

Then Naomi said unto her, My daughter, shall I not seek rest for thee? And is not Boaz of our kindred, with whose maidens thou wast? Behold, he winnoweth barley to-night on the threshing floor. Wash thyself therefore, and anoint thee, and put thy raiment upon thee, and get thee down to the floor: but make not thyself known unto the man, until he shall have done eating and drinking. And when he lieth down, thou shalt mark the place where he shall lie, and thou shalt go in, and uncover his feet, and lay thee down; and he will tell thee what thou shalt do.

And she went down unto the floor, and did according to all that her mother in law bade her.

And at midnight, the man turned and beheld, a woman lay at his feet. And he said, Who art thou? And she answered, I am Ruth thine handmaid: spread therefore thy skirt over thine handmaid; for thou art a near kinsman. And he said, Blessed be thou of the Lord, my daughter: for thou hast showed more kindness in the latter end than at the beginning, inasmuch as thou followest not young men, whether poor or rich. And now, my daughter, fear not: I will do to thee all that thou requirest: for all the city of my people doth know that thou art a virtuous woman.
