 1/2 at 64 1/2 and 27 1/2, respectively.
 Canada Steamship dropped 2 1/2
 to 27 1/2. General Dynamics ad-
 vanced 1/2 to 100 per cent ex-stock divi-
 dend. Other losses were small.
 Senior metals were higher. Mis-
 cellaneous industrials and papers
