IN MEMORIAM

MR. NORMAN C. STEWART
There passed away in the P.E.I. Hospital, Charlottetown on October 3, 1956, Mr. Norman C. Stewart of High Bank.
Mr. Stewart was born in Caledonia, P.E.I. May 31st, 1876. In 1906 he removed to High Bank where he has since resided. He was a man widely known, respected and esteemed by a very large circle of friends.

For some 39 years he served as an elder in the Little Sands United Church. And at many times represented his Congregation at the higher Courts of the Church. He was one of the best known and well informed members of the Loyal Orange Association in which he held membership for 61 years. He was for over 50 years a member of the Royal Black Preceptory. He held honorary membership in all branches of the order and was a Past Jr. Deputy Grand Master.

Mr. Stewart was twice married. His first wife, Christina A. MacPhee of Bellevue, passed away in 1912. In 1916 he married Sarah A. MacKay of High Bank who survives him and the following family of three sons and six daughters: Lawrence, Charlottetown; William S. Murray River; Norman E. Calgary, Alta.; Sadie, Mrs. Joseph Bell, May. Mrs. John Bell and Evelyn, Mrs. Ernest J. Machon, all of Murray Harbor. Mrs. Clarence White, Barrie, Ontario, Miss Betty at home and Mrs. Janet Stewart of Charlottetown. Two sons predeceased him. Laughlin E. gave his life in World War 2 in 1940. Malcolm N. died in Port Arthur, Ontario in 1951.

One sister, Mrs. Joseph Reid, Pigeon Cove, Mass. and one brother John S. Stewart, Caledonia survive. 17 grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren also survive. The funeral was held on Sunday, October 7th and after a brief service at his home. A public service was held in the Little Sands United Church, which was very largely attended. The pastor, Rev. L.S. Woolfrey, conducted the service. Miss Violet Daley sang as a solo "Beautiful Isle of Somewhere."

Six of his neighbors acted as pall-bearers: Messrs. Bruce Stewart, Angus M. Stewart, John D. Bruce, George Livingstone, Walter Livingstone and Stanley Livingstone.

The many flowers showed the respect held for the deceased and sympathy for the family. Members of the Orange Lodge acted as flower bearers.

Rev. L. S. Woolfrey conducted the service at the grave. The Loyal Orange Association conducted their committal service with the Prncial Grand Master, A.A. MacCallum in charge assisted by Frank MacDonald and W.S. Buell.
