Federation Of Agriculture News

Weather Talk
We feel that the weather this Province has enjoyed since the first of November calls for a vote of confidence in the weatherman. From the standpoint of fine warm weather, lack of frost, and freedom from storms, we have been very highly favoured.

Price Of Machinery Parts
Cost of farm machinery has been steadily mounting and we wonder to what extent competition plays a part in controlling prices as between different companies. It is apparent that competition does not enter into the price of parts which in many cases have reached a point which can be described by no other word than exorbitant.

Leadership Course
The Department of Agriculture, in co-operation with the Department of Education and the Junior Farmers Federation, is sponsoring a Leadership Training Course at the Vocational School from January 2nd to 6th. Training in conducting meetings, directing recreation and planning programs will all receive attention and the facilities of the Vocational School, used to provide instruction in practical skills will be useful to both boys and girls on the farm and in the home. The program is a very excellent one and young people who arrange to attend this Course will be amply repaid for their efforts.

Novo Scotia Annual Meeting
The 55th annual meeting of the Nova Scotia Farmers Association will be held at Debert on December 27th, 28th, and 29th. Dr. H. H. Hannam will address the Convention on Thursday evening. The Farmers' Association in Nova Scotia is the counterpart of our Federation of Agriculture.

Potato Board Meetings
The results of the joint meeting of the New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island Potato Boards and Agricultural officials will be followed with much interest by our producers. The Hon. Mr. Gardiner has stated that the responsibility for suggestions and plans pertinent to price support are the responsibility of the Potato Boards. The necessity of prompt and co-ordinated effort cannot be over-emphasized. We expect that the whole potato situation will be given a very thorough overhauling at this meeting and hope that some definite decisions will be arrived at.

Dominion Conference
One of the most significant statements made at the recent Dominion Provincial Agricultural Conference was that of Mr. Gardiner in which he acknowledged that opinions of organized farmers carried weight, said Mr. Gardiner. "Your opinions have much to do with decisions arrived at by the Government and that is why you seem to approve of most of them." Mr. Gardiner also stated that if the Freight Assistance Policy were to be continued those in favour should say so in an emphatic way. He was convinced of the need of the policy, but others might not be so remarked.
