He was second Canadian in the event as Bob Reid of Vancouver placed fifth with a vault of 13 feet 6 inches. At Victoria Reid again edged Alfred as he soared over the bar at 14 feet even to trim the Island athlete by six inches.

The announcement by the national executive of the Liberal federation referred to Mr. MacTavish continuing the job "during the period of transition in which the federation now is engaged."

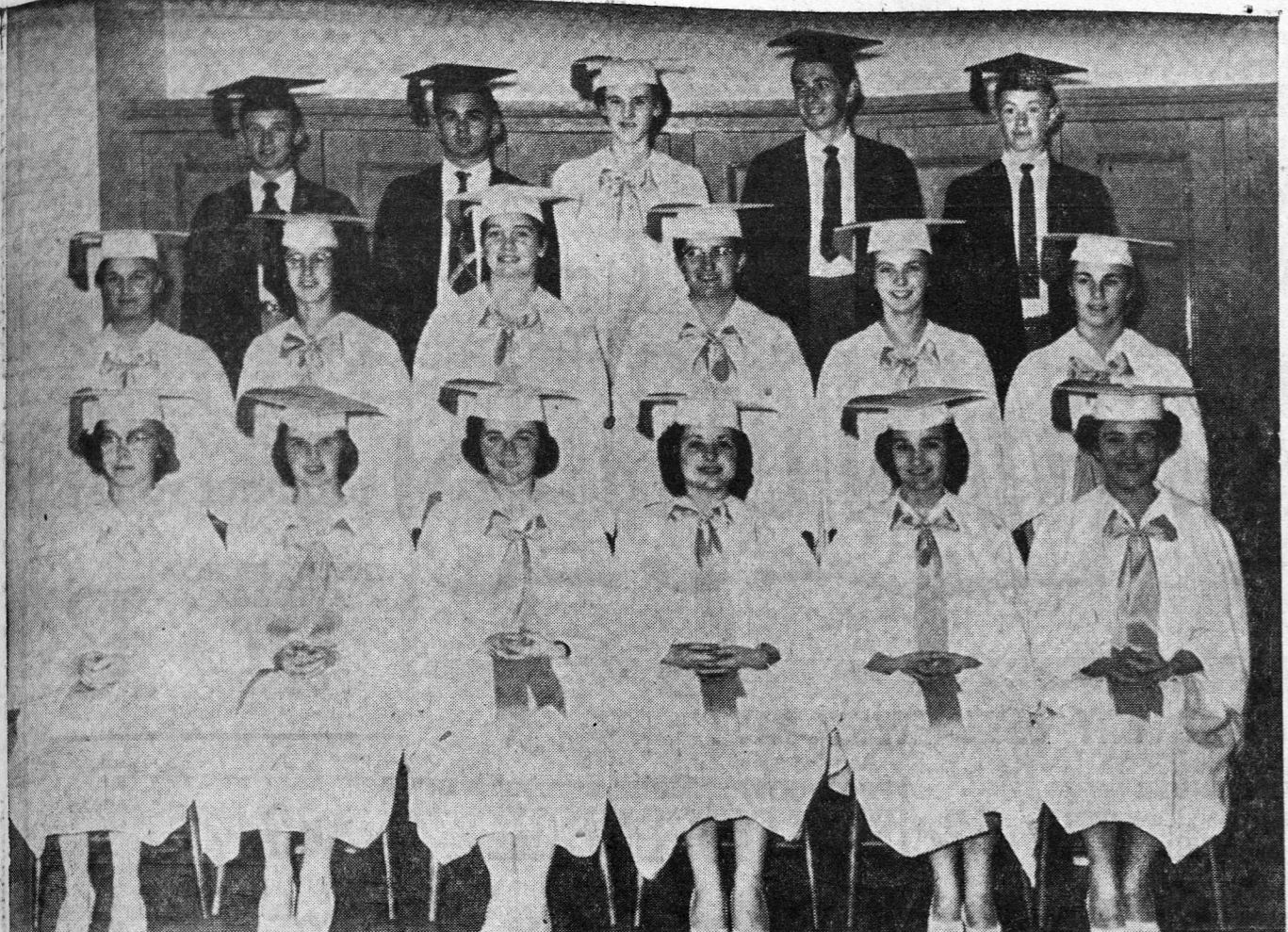
