Priest Gives Room To Aid Broadcasting

BETHLEHEM (AP) - Father Claudio gave up his sparsely-furnished room Tuesday to permit Christians around the world to listen to Christmas religious services from Christ's birthplace.

Father Claudio, a Franciscan monk, has a cell in the Terra Sancta Monastery which adjoins the Church of the Nativity. It was taken over by the broadcast broadcasting service to relay Christmas services from the church around the world, while the monk himself participated in religious rites from the church.

Christmas came to the Holy Land with ancient pomp and pageantry. Beneath the Church of the Nativity, in the grotto where Christ was born, Roman Patriarch Alberto Gori re-enacted the scene by lifting from the cold floor a doll representing the Christ Child and placing it in a manger crib.

Bethlehem church bells pealed. A group of electors above the church symbolized the ancient Star of Bethlehem. The service was jammed with pilgrims from a round of the world.

Unlike previous years there were no incidents at the holy shrine of Christianity. In recent years had feelings among Roman Catholic, Greek and Armenian rites which share jurisdiction over the church has even led to blows.

Immediately after the Roman Catholic ceremonies, Greek priests - who celebrate their Christmas Jan. 7 - entered the grotto bearing flickering candles and smouldering incense for purification ceremonies.

4 P.Q. Boys Are Drowned

QUEBEC (CP) - The government ice-breaker Montcalm Tuesday abandoned the search for four boys believed to have drowned while fishing through the ice on the St. Lawrence River.

The Department of Transport's rescue services which coordinated the search activities of the ice-breaker, helicopters and search parties said it is believed the boys' cabin was dropped through the ice into the river.

The boys, ranging in age from 12 to 15, started fishing Saturday morning in Quebec, 40 miles upstream from Quebec City.

Trace of the boys or cabin has not yet been spotted by any of the search teams. The presumed victims were identified as a son of Mrs. Katie L. Gillis and the late Malcolm Gillis, 49, a seaman with the Royal Canadian Airforce, before, during and after the Second World War. He had moments ago in the war with the 110th A.C. Squadron.

No Decision Is Male Yet

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) - Were there any turncoats among the Cuban invasion prisoners?

Many remember prisoners in Korea who collaborated in one way or another with the Communists. But judging from comments of returned Cuban prisoners themselves, there was no such collaboration in the jails where the invasion prisoners were held for 20 months.

"We stuck together," said Raoul Arango Kindlan. "We kept each other's morale up."

Said Luis Entralgo: "I never heard of a single man who had abandoned us to do with the Communists."

Apparently the Communists made no serious effort to convert any prisoners.

"They didn't attack us physically," said Humberto Sanchez. "They worked on our minds, to humiliate and upset us."

Edgardo Butrari said this including changing meals widely from day to day, and occasionally doubling prison terms with the threat of sending them back into their cells in the middle of the night.

An effort to separate the men into income groups, with prizes for the lowest - income men, failed.

"We refused to accept anything for one group, that wouldn't be given to all," said Butrari.

Castro helped drive the men closer together by lumping them as "yellow workers" and treating them all yellow cotton shirts to wear. The men adopted them as a symbol of opposition.

Outer Mongolian Premier Praises Russian Policy

PEKING (Reuters) - Outer Mongolian Premier Yuzhigin Tsedenbal Tuesday praised Russia's policy of peaceful coexistence in a speech before Chinese Communist Premier Chen En-lai.

Diplomatic observers here said Tsedenbal's speech was a forceful reaffirmation of Outer Mongolia's support for the Soviet attitude to international problems that has been challenged by China.

Tsedenbal spoke at a banquet given in his honor by Chou. The Mongolian leader was here for the signing tomorrow of a treaty fixing the 2,300-mile border between his state and China.

The observers said the main purpose in signing the treaty at this time was to put pressure on India to negotiate its border dispute with China.

Completion of the treaty was announced Sunday night but details have remained secret.

Outer Mongolia, a part of the Chinese empire, forms a buffer state
