



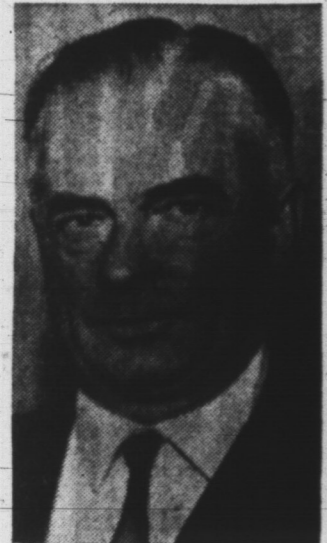

**Non-medical employees strike Bronx hospital**

NEW YORK (AP) - Picketing resumed today at Montefiore Hospital in the Bronx which has evacuated about 150 of its 620 patients in expectation of an all-day work stoppage by almost 1,000 non-medical employees.

The hospital has stopped all admissions and closed its outpatient department. Montefiore Hospital evacuated patients Wednesday after a six-hour work stoppage by nearly all of the 600 kitchen, laundry, technical and clerical workers and nurses aides on the day shift. They marched outside the hospital from 8 a.m. to noon in a demonstration for pay increases.

**Canadians in good form**

BROOKWOOD, England (Reuters) - Several of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association team showed up well in the Bisley Elkington Aggregate Trophy competition here, based on scores in his week's three long-range shoots, two at 900 yards and one at 1,000.

There was a tie for top place between C. McEachran of Glasgow and J. Norman of Newport Monmouthshire, both scoring 129 out of a possible 150.

Arnold Park of Winnipeg was eighth with 136 and Don Sewell of Winnipeg 17th, scoring 134. Other scores were LAC Jim Hennok of Toronto 135, LAC Ernie Roger of Napanee, Alta. 132, and Arne Sorensen of Calgary 131.

Cadet Capt. Bill Cotlick, 18, of Winnipeg, scoring 186 out of 200, was fourth in the young rifleman's aggregate, which was won by A. J. Morphet of Cambridge University, who scored 192 in four events at 200, 300, 505 and 600 yards.

DOUBLE WINNER - McEachran also won the Tuesday aggregate trophy-delayed results of which announced today-with 169 out of a possible 175 in three events at 300, 600 and 1,000 yards.

Sorensen was seventh with 164, and Nicholas Beckness of Montreal 13th with 162. Lt.-Col. Bill Strachan of Ottawa, the DCRA team commander, won the Fauthorpe silver medal today for his 98 score in the Queen's Prize first stage. The medal is for the top score by an overseas competitor in the first stage. Although Lt. Col. Strachan was not the top-scoring overseas marksman his was the top score entered.
