There has been a tentative agreement reached between the steel workers and employers of Wheeling Steel after a six weeks strike. Drought news continues unfavorable. Mr. Lewis also continues to issue considerable publicity concerning his drive for unionization of the steel workers. If it were not for the drought, we believe the market would do better. However, a good many of the utilities acted well even in the last hour and unless the other two sections on the list are reactionary today, we believe the utilities will do better especially Consolidated Edison, which stood out. Loews will also probably do better.

LIVESTOCK

(Canadian Press) MONTEAL, July 7—Total sales on the Montreal livestock market today totalled 968.

Cattle were steady. Medium good to good steers brought \$5.50 with medium kinds from \$4.75 to \$5.25. Good butcher cows were mostly \$4 and medium kinds from \$3.25 to \$3.75 with common butchers down to \$2.50. Common bulls ranged from \$2.75 to \$3.75.

Calves were in good demand and prices firm to 25 cents higher in spots. Good quality calves brought \$6.50 to \$6.75 with a few tops at \$7. Fair to medium quality brought \$5 to \$6. Grassers were mostly \$4.

Spring lambs brought \$9 with culls out at \$7. Sheep ranged from \$2 to \$4. Bacon hogs were \$9.35 to \$9.40 fed and watered. Selects drew \$1 per hog premium. Butchers, heavies and lights were \$8.85 to \$8.90 and extra heavies \$8.35 to \$8.40. Sows were from \$6 to \$7.25.

GRAIN

(Canadian Press) CHICAGO, July 7—All of today's sweeping gains of wheat prices were more than wiped out in late dealings.

Heavy rains reported at a number of places in Saskatchewan, notably around Regina, led to a general selling rush, and quotations broke fast. The tumble carried the entire wheat market to well below yesterday's finish, and bearishly influenced all other grain to some extent.

Wheat smashed downward almost six cents from early tops, but rebounded about a cent just at the last, closing excited, 1-8 to 3-4 under yesterday's finish. July 1-8 5-8 to 3-4, Sept 1-05 3-4 to 1-7-8; Belgium 16-93; Germany 40-41; Canada 99 7-8.

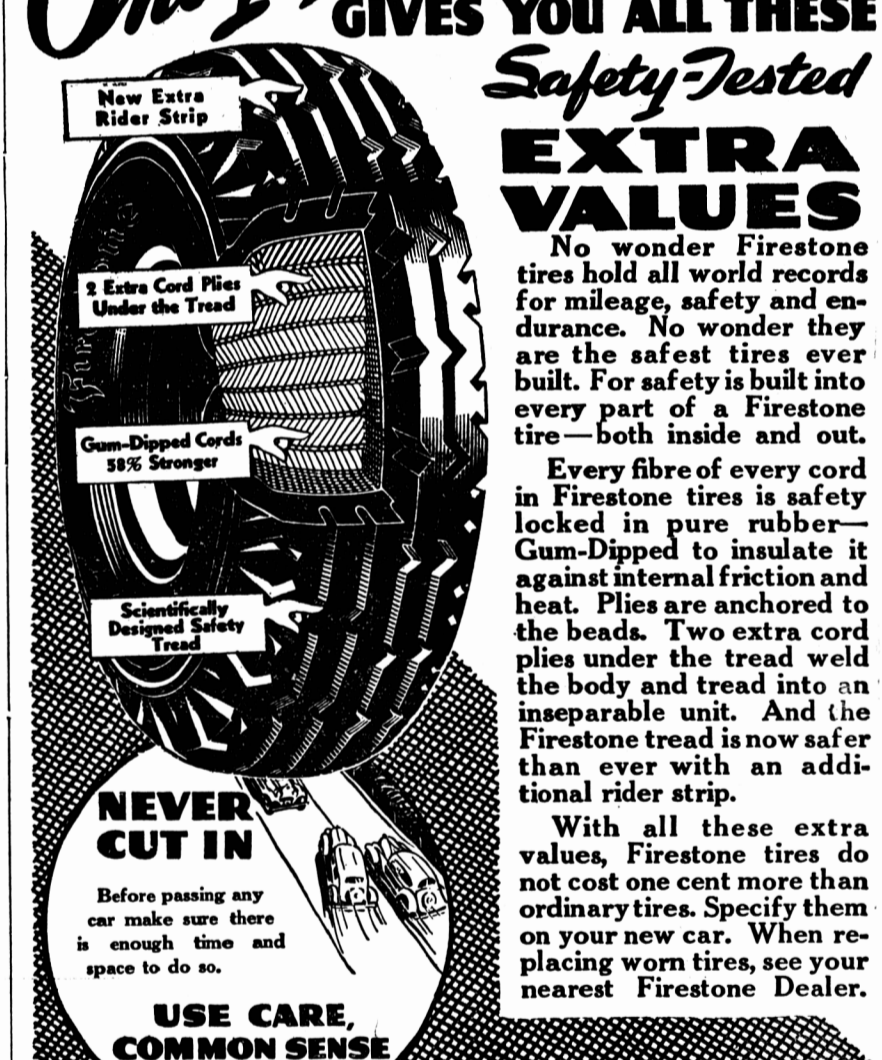
