British Politics.

In the House of Commons a few days ago Smith, Government Leader, gave notice that the Government would on Monday present a bill asking a vote of £5,000,000 for the extension of the Ashbourne Act.

Gladstone gave notice that on Monday, when the motion was made he would, if the proposal meant an addition of £5,000,000 to the £5,000,000 already spent, move an alternative to the effect that the House should proceed to deal with the question of arrears and apply to Ireland the principle already applied with such great advantage in the case of the Scotch crofters.

When the estimates for prisons came up for consideration, Dillon moved a reduction of the salary of Dr. Barr, as a protest against his conduct in Dundalk Jail.

Dr. Clark (Radical) believed Dr. Barr a disgrace to his profession, and Labouchere said Dr. Barr had been directly responsible for two deaths.

The motion to reduce Dr. Barr's salary was negatived, 116 to 67.

Comparing the running expenses of the Grand Trunk and English railroads, Sir Henry Tyler, in his address to the Grand Trunk shareholders, made the statement that the wages of mechanics in Canada were 33 per cent. higher than in England, and the cost of materials from 24 to 72 per cent. higher.

Beecher once said:—"I can show ambitious men, who seek political preferment, their types on the seashore. There you will see old worthless sticks of drift-wood come rolling in on the crest of some wave; these are now the types of political men coming into power.

While the German court was in mourning for the late Emperor Frederick, his own son, the present Emperor, went off on a jollification tour among the other courts of Europe. It is not surprising that some comment was made on this, and other matters connected with the memory of the late Emperor William, and he has accordingly ordered that the press shall make no further reference to his father's name or his family affairs.

The Cunarders are doing a smashing business of late. Two collisions in one day, one on each side of the Atlantic, would seem to be crowding matters. The extraordinary way in which one-third of a steamship was cut off by one of the Cunarders, and sent adrift on its own account, while the other two-thirds was anchored with cargo all right, indicates great proficiency in this sort of thing on the part of the Cunarder, or wonderful vitality in the severed ship.

Mr. Phelps, the American Minister, in a speech before the members of the Glasgow Bar a few days ago, said that nothing in the administration of justice in Great Britain was more excellent than the prompt and effective manner in which the laws were executed, but the legal proceedings here he thought were too expensive.

The Americans are without question a go-ahead and wide-awake class of people, and generally a step in advance of their Canadian cousins; and with the worry and turmoil of active business, and mad haste to get rich, they are fast undermining their health and making physical wrecks of themselves.
