Q. How can I fatten thin hands? A. Wash the hands in hot water, dry, and rub a little olive oil into them.

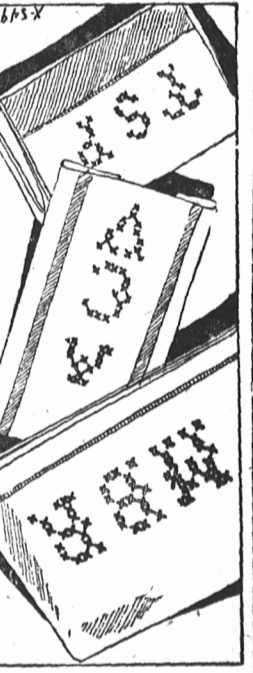

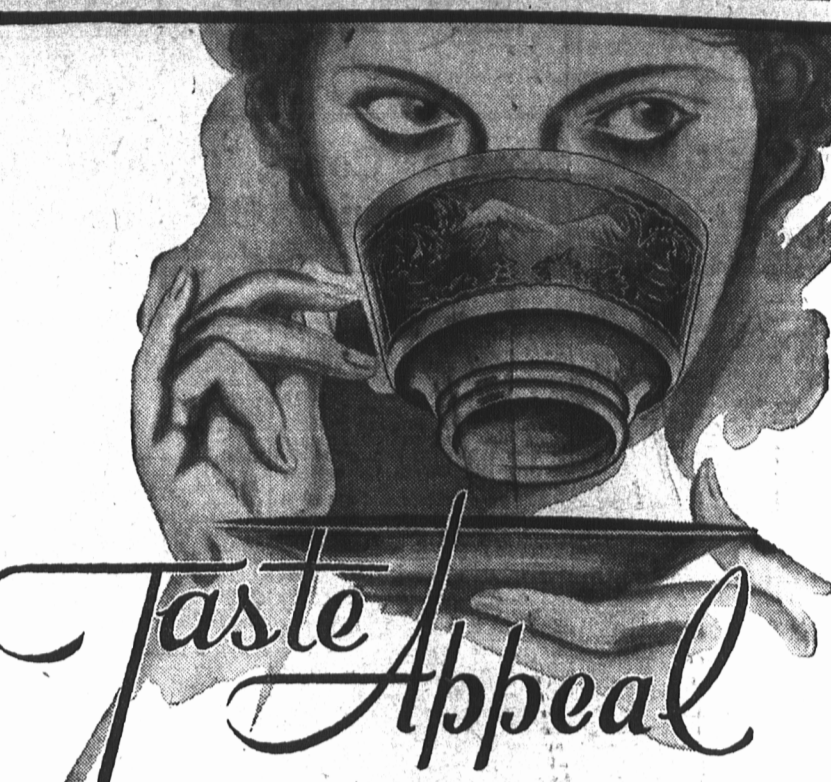
Q. When an invitation is received to a church wedding, and not to the reception, does it require an answer? A. Not unless the wedding is small and the invitation is a personally written note or letter.
