Insurance Realm Started As Centenarian Gets Policy

TORONTO — A sprightly great grandmother who celebrated her 100th birthday this summer, and who happily says, "I live a day at a time", has applied for and received a hospital, medical and surgical insurance policy.

Continental Casualty Company was the daring Santa Claus to grant Mrs. Marion Morris the coverage until she cancels it or reaches the end of her years in her second century.

Mrs. Morris is a straight, brisk diminutive old lady, who does not wear glasses, and does not wear a hearing aid for ordinary conversation. There is nothing about her to suggest her real age but the insurance company was not fooled.

"We knew her age and gave her the policy just after her 100th Birthday," said Ross Heins,

but is still started the Canadian insurance realm. She is covered for \$3 a day hospital charges; \$3 a day for medical expenses; and \$225 for surgery, for as long as the policy is continued.

Mrs. Morris was born in London, England, in 1859, and trained for a nurse, but married George Morris, a Welshman, instead of nursing. She was post-mistress at Fladbury, Worcestershire for several years, coming to Canada in 1911. She has three

grandchildren and two great-grandchildren and now lives with her son-in-law, former Toronto Detective John D. Kearney.

She is an expert needlewoman and when visited in her pleasant little living room, surrounded by her family photographs and mementos, she not only seems to defy her years, but personifies the old truth that you can grow old gracefully if you have a cheerful and resilient spirit.

She was the least surprised of

all that an insurance policy should be granted to her at 100 years. But she sincerely appreciates it because some day it could mean less expense for her son-in-law.

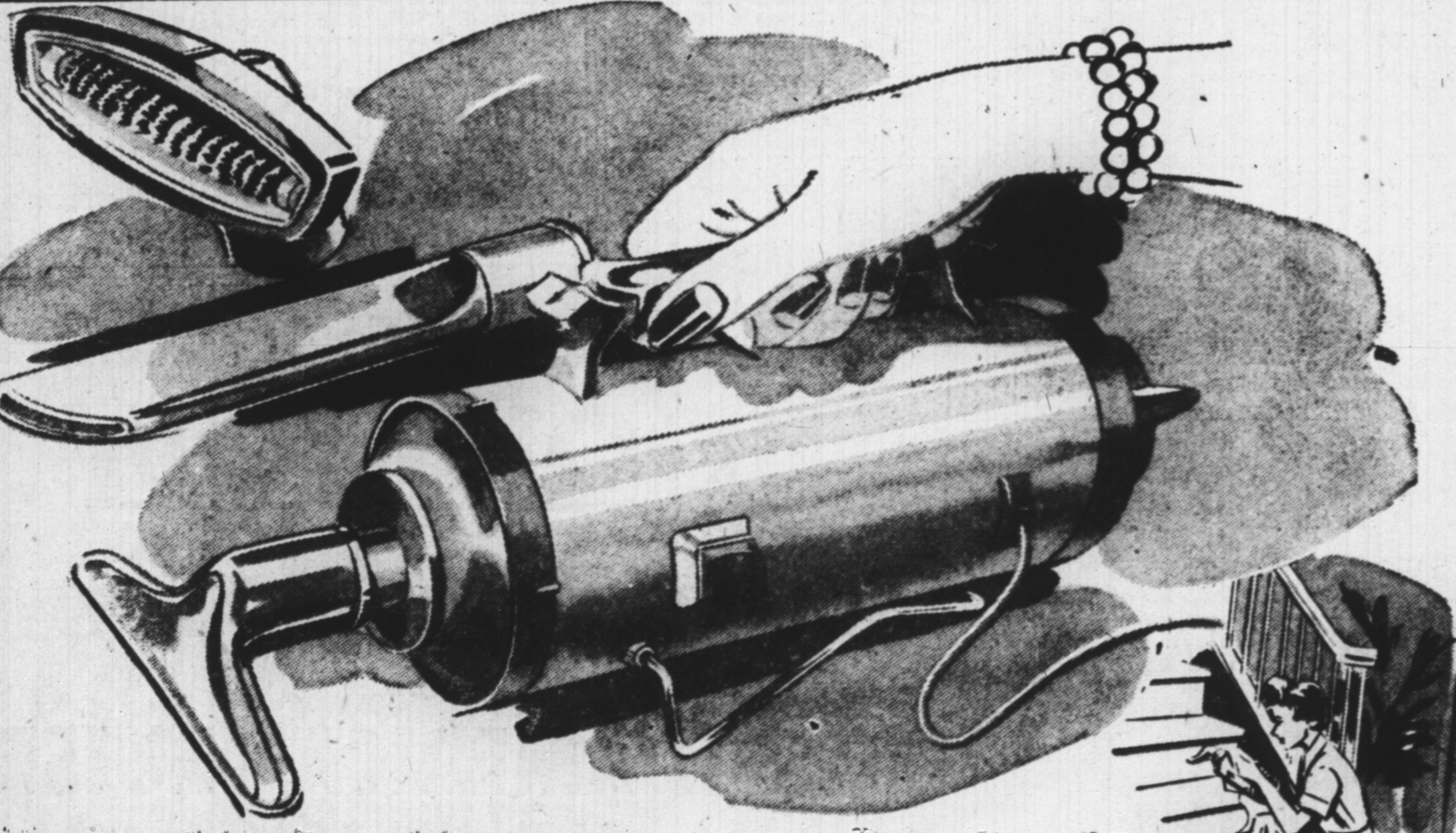

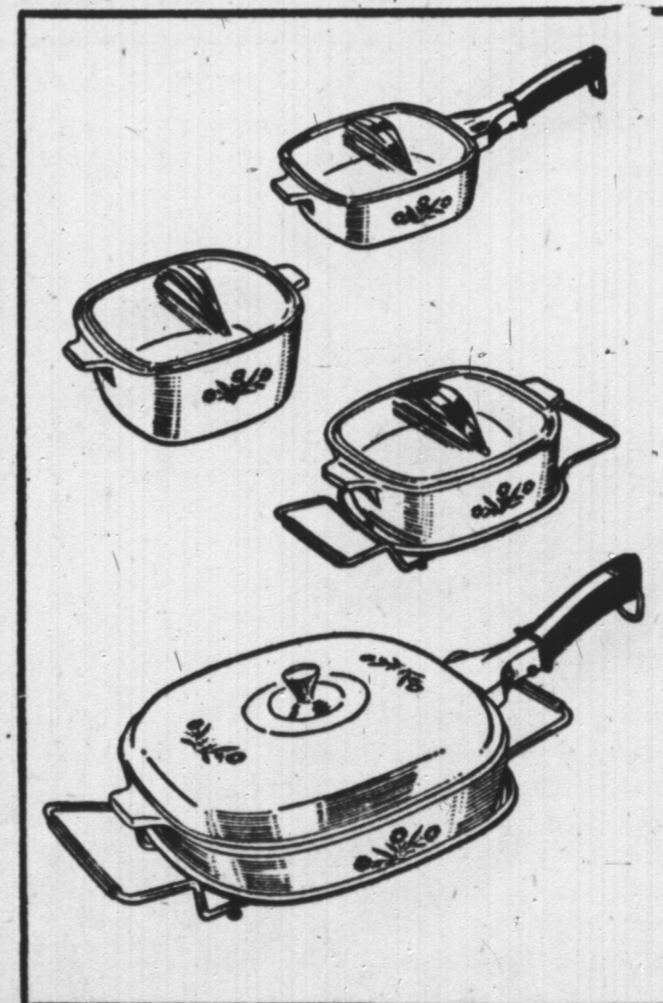
