Irish Benefit Concert

At 8:00 p.m. on Sunday, November 16, an evening of entertainment will be presented at the Basilica Recreation Centre. Featuring such well-known artists as "Speed the Plough" and "The Moonshine Men", the programme will present a wide-ranging sampling of Irish music, song and dance by Island artists.

Presented under the auspices of the Social Action Commission of the Charlottetown Diocese, and with the assistance of the Benevolent Irish Society, the program forms part of a fund-raising effort on behalf of the nearly 3,000 men and women held prisoner in the jails of Northern Ireland.

As a spokesman for the Social Action Committee commented, "In our view, the issues are strictly non-political and non-sectarian: put simply, our interest lies in human rights --- those of the prisoners of all faiths --- and it is our hope that the Island people will respond to this

appeal with their customary openmindedness and generosity. Besides, this evening will be enjoyable, for our Island artists and friends have donated their talents as well as their time to this important cause."

Speaking on behalf of another of the sponsoring group, an officer of the Benevolent Irish Society said that "If anybody thinks that Irish music is just for St. Patrick's Day, or that it's all 'How are Things in Gloccamorra,' then they're in for a real treat next Sunday. Just wait and see!"
