

# CANADA EMPLOYMENT CENTRE ON CAMPUS

The following is an update on how the recruiting process is going: We have had 14 employers conduct their interviews to date, giving a total of 114 interviews. As mentioned last week, all those recruiters have expressed how satisfied they are with the calibre of the candidates they have been seeing, which is a credit to you all.

In the next month we have at least four more recruiters scheduled plus two who will be interviewing off-campus. Again, for your interest, the following have indicated their plans to interview but have not yet finalized their times: Day and Ross, Irving Oil, Proctor and Gamble and National Sea Products.

For those of you who receive job offers through this process, standard guidelines have been set up as principles for employers and students to follow. Several of the more significant ones for you to note are:

- employers are not to rescind offers of employment nor renege upon acceptance of employment.

- students are not to accept more than one offer of employment nor renege upon acceptance of employment.

- employers are not to force job acceptances prior to January 15 for offers made on or before December 31. If offers are made after Jan. 1 to students of two semester institutions, the earliest forced acceptance date is four weeks after the offer, except after March 1 when a period of two weeks will be sufficient.

Student Services also has a financial aid booklet, and vertical file that contains information on bursaries and scholarships. I suggest that you take advantage of this system to check into those monies that have upcoming deadlines for applications. File #5 - Bilingualism in Education

Federal/Provincial programs (Dept. of Education)

For 1988, the following programs available to Island students are anticipated:

1. 1988 Summer Language Bursary Program - '88 materials tentatively available by mid-January '88.

2. Official Language Monitor Program - materials for 88-89 school year should be available by mid-January '88.

3. Official Language Study Fellowship Program - Application forms available by late April '88.

The application forms are available only through correspondence to the Department of Education at the time of their release because of the "first come, first serve" policy.
