LONDON, July 27—(Thursday)—(C.P.)—A bombing attributed by police to the Irish Republican Army early today wrecked a canal bridge near Liverpool a few hours after other bombs shattered baggage rooms in two of London's largest railway stations, killing one person and injuring nearly a score of others.
