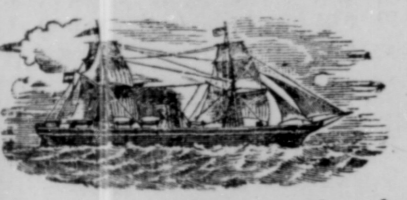

Local and Other Items.

ASSAULT AT SOUTHPORT.—A man named Kay yesterday arrested for assaulting Mr. Charles Walker, blacksmith, of Southport, on Tuesday last. Mr. Walker, who is very well known in Charlottetown, is said to have been so injured as to be confined to his house.

MASONIC.—The Grand Lodge of New Brunswick F & A. M., will convene in annual session in the Masonic Temple, St. John, on Tuesday, August 22nd. On Wednesday of the same week the annual convocation of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter will also be held. The premier grand council of the Royal and Select Masons and appendant orders in Canada will hold a conference of the cryptic rite of Canada the same week as grand lodge to consider the formation of a grand council of the cryptic rite for Canada, having its grand east in St. John.

DAWSON CITY OVERRUN.—Mr. R. E. Edgar, one of the passengers of the Portland recently arrived at San Francisco from Klondike, takes a very gloomy view of the state of affairs in Dawson. "There is nothing doing there," he said. "It is frightfully dull. The place is overrun with unemployed men at there are at least two men for every job. There is no suffering. There seems to be food for all, but there are a great many men who are without money and who will undoubtedly suffer. I have no doubt that the government will have to step in and take care of these men. There are hundreds anxious to leave if they had the means, but they have not, and there is an end of it."

GOWNS.—It is said that the wife of Li Hung Chang possesses more gowns, to say nothing of her supply of extra coats and trousers, than any other living woman. Mrs. Li is credited with having no fewer than 2,000 gowns and is said to have 1,000 waiting women in attendance on her. Probably 500 women are hired to spy on the other 500 and keep them from making inroads on Mrs. Li's wardrobe. The Princess of Wales has an extensive supply of gowns, but the Princess of Sagan is said to be still better supplied with frocks. The Countess of Castellane has one of the largest ward robes in the world, if the gossips may be believed. They say she never wears the same evening gown more than two or three times.

ENORMOUS SCHEME.—Engineer George W. Ratter, in charge of the survey for the proposed ship canal from the Great Lakes to the Atlantic ocean, has completed his preliminary work and drawn his report. The project is to cut a canal thirty feet deep and 340 feet wide, which is three and one-third times the depth and five times the width of the Erie canal, from Lake Erie to Lake Ontario around Niagara Falls, leaving Lake Ontario at Oswego, through the Oswego river to Oneida Lake, thence through the Mohawk to the Hudson river. A single lock will be a thousand feet long, with walls over fifty feet high. The great problem has been to find storage for water to feed this great canal on its various levels, and yet to not injure the water supply of manufacturing concerns now using the various rivers.

\$70,000.00 SAVED.—The value of a live opposition was demonstrated in the House of Commons a few days ago when the item was reached of \$10,000 for a wharf at Marias. Mr. Fielding explained that Marias was in Bonaventure county Quebec, and that the work would cost \$70,000.

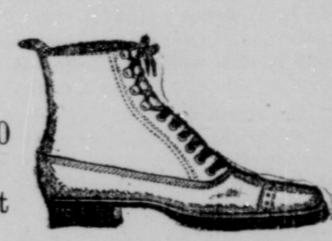
