A "HUMOR" OF THE CAM- PAIGN.

The Toronto Globe says:

The attempt to represent the Dominion as
groaning under a load of taxation is one of
the humors of the present campaign. The
groans are confined to a small coterie of the
Opposition.

We do not know that the opposition
has represented the country as "groan-
ing" under a load of taxation; but at the
same time the increase in the
taxation is a matter of vital import-
ance.

The people put the Liberals in
power, for one thing, to reduce the
taxes, which they promised to do. Mr.
Fielding has brought the returns down
to the close of the fiscal year ended
30th June, 1900, and by comparison
they make the following showing:

Total Increase	Taxes	Over 1895.

1897.....	28,648,662	\$3,202,484
1898.....	29,576,455	4,130,277
1899.....	34,958,069	9,566,891
1900.....	37,919,872	12,423,694

Now for a little mental arithmetic.

The population of Canada is, say, 6
millions—it is really less. This means
that for the year ended 30th June,
1900, the people paid in actual taxes
on the goods they bought, to support
Tarte and Blair, \$6.30 a head, or \$31-
50 for an average family of five per-
sons, as compared with \$4.24 a head,
or \$21.20 for an average family of five
persons in 1895.

The increase is \$2.06 a head, or
\$10.30 a family.

The crops have been most abun-
dant for several years in succession and
the war in South Africa and the
general prosperity have caused Eng-
land to buy more largely than ever of
our products. This has enabled the
people to pay the enormous taxes im-
posed by the Laurier Government
without very much groaning. But what
of the years of lean crops and bad
times, when the British workingman is
not able to buy so fully? Looking to
the future a little, is our government
pursuing a safe policy, in collecting,
then spending, all this enormous
revenue.—Moncton Times.
