A Teachers' Study Group was held in the Montague High School on Friday afternoon with Mr. J. B. MacCallum as chairman. A large number of teachers from the Inspectorates of Mr. H. J. Hynes and Mr. A. Gilmore were in attendance. Mr. Gilmore explained the form and purpose of the present Grade VIII type of objective tests. The new form this year would differ from the old in that the tests would be found in one booklet instead of three, and would contain nine sub-tests instead of the former eight. Making, he said, would not be done by cancellation, and all questions therein contained could be answered from the course of studies. A total of 260 questions would comprise the examination. A group discussion followed in which it was pointed out that the examination failed to take into account the different aptitudes of the students in that some were more adapted to writing out essay type answers, rather than setting down isolated details. Moreover, it eliminated part value in questions so that a student either gets full marks or zero. Mr. Gilmore pointed out, however, that the tests were used as a measure, rather than a basis for grading pupils. Mr. H. J. Hynes continued with the discussion on the grading of pupils, showing that a student's work, in view of his capabilities, should be the basis of grading, and that even slower students might be advanced, if they could be given a special course to follow. Considerable discussion took place regarding school property improvement, the Grade X project, and school closing; after which the meeting adjourned.
