DEADLINE APRIL 30, 1980 CANADIAN LABOUR CONGRESS

The Canadian Labour Congress have made available 24 bursaries which will be awarded to the sons or daughters of union members in Canada entering their first year of post-secondary education. Value \$500.00.

DEADLINE MARCH 31, 1980 UNIVERSITY OF VICTORIA SCHOLARSHIP IN LAW

Three scholarships in the amount of \$3,500.00

each, are available for students entering, in September, their first academic year of the course leading to the Bachelor of Laws degree at the University of Victoria.

SAMUEL BRONFMAN FOUNDATION

To be eligible candidates must be full time Business faculty members of Canadian universities, offering the Bachelor's degree in Business. Persons on leave

of absence for study or research are also eligible for this award. Persons on temporary appointment due to be terminated in the Spring or Summer prior to the academic year for which the award is applicable are ineligible. A full time faculty member holding a joint appointment on a Business Faculty and the Faculty of another discipline is eligible.
