DIED FROM HIS FEELINGS - The three-year-old son of Samuel Bevis died at Halifax on Sunday from a terrible accident. The child with another was left playing in a room. The latter in play placed a lighted match under the clothing of young Bevis, who was soon enveloped in flames.

A PRECIOUS SCOTCHMEL - John Tomblinson, aged 32, of Eglington, Ont., has eloped with his wife's niece, Miss Anne Geron, deserting a wife and two small children, the latter aged 5 and 3 years. Before leaving, Tomblinson kissed his wife and children, and then abstracted from the bureau drawer every cent of money in the house except five cents.

REUNION ACCIDENT - A horse owned by Mark Wright & Co. took fright near the owners premises this morning and started to run away. He had not gone very far before he slipped on the platform and fell against one of the windows in the show room on Kent Street, breaking several large panes of glass and tearing away a portion of the sash. The horse was somewhat cut as a result of the collision.

A FRIENDLY DEED - A sheep owned by Mr. W. Harding Steeves, Hillsboro, was found by the owner recently in a terribly mutilated state. It had been cut under the belly to the length of 15 inches or more, and the skin separated from the body and partially dragged on the ground, the animal being able to walk. THE HOOPER CASE - A despatch from Toronto says that Prof. Ellis, the analyst of the School of Science to whom was entrusted the task of analyzing the contents of the stomach of the late Mrs. Hooper, has handed his report in to the Attorney-General's department. His investigation did not disclose any trace of poisoning. In accordance with this report the coroner's jury has returned a verdict to the effect that Mrs. Hooper came to her death from causes unknown. The preliminary trial was to have been resumed at Joliet yesterday.

LOSSES ON CATTLE - Cable despatches received at Montreal the latter part of last week in regard to the sale of cattle in the British markets show a considerable loss on Canadian shipments, some of the exporters having lost \$6 to \$7 per head. The markets for the last few weeks have been the worst of the season. Shipments up to date have been 16,446 head of cattle behind last season, the figure being 76,702 head this year and 93,148 head for the same period last year. On account of the restrictions placed upon Canadian cattle in Great Britain, the stockers trade with Scotland had been considerably killed. Up to this date last year 19,018 stockers had gone forward, while only 25 animals have been shipped this season. The ranch cattle this year have turned out well. There have been no deaths during the preceding seasons, while they have generally been in good condition.
