

Falls Agreement Is More Remote

QUEBEC (CP)—Premier Lesage said here the possibility of a special session of the Quebec legislature this fall to deal with the development of Churchill Falls in Labrador is becoming more and more remote.

Following a cabinet meeting, the premier said that necessary studies toward bringing about an eventual agreement between Hydro-Quebec and British Newfoundland Corp. "are taking longer than we thought."

He was discussing negotiations on harnessing the river's hydro potential of 7,000,000 horsepower in the projected \$1,600,000,000 undertaking.

Negotiations have concerned the sale of Churchill Falls power controlled by Brinco, to Hydro-Quebec, the price Crown-owned Hydro-Quebec would pay.

Quality Said Main Concern In CMA Stand On Medicare

ST. ANDREW'S, N.B. (CP)—The president of the Canadian Medical Association said here that Canadian doctors, in their stand on medicare, are concerned not with money but the quality of medical services.

"We are determined to protect the freedom of the doctor to give high quality medical services to his patient," Dr. Robert O. Jones of Halifax told the New Brunswick Medical Society's annual meeting here.

Dr. Jones said some of the medicare proposals put forward at the federal-provincial conference at Ottawa in July could lead to a degradation of medical services in Canada.

He said the CMA objects to the suggestion that it be a universal compulsory plan and that it be administered by a government agency.

"We have always insisted that every person should have available to him the medical care

Teenage Violence In Sweden Blamed On Dullness Of State

STOCKHOLM (Reuters)—early or late teens have been Youth guidance experts said here a widespread explosion of teenage violence here and in Oslo, Norway, represented a protest against middle-class conventions and dullness of life in a welfare state.

During the last three nights there have been similar riots in the two normally staid Scandinavian capitals.

HULL, Que. (CP)—The exam-marking machine used by the Quebec department of education to mark papers of grade 11 students of the Outaouais regional school board has a perfect record.

Not one of the 7,000 papers was marked correctly.

Omer Plouffe, general director of schools, told the board Monday the electronic brain seemed to have "upped the low marks and decreased the high marks."

"This created some unusual situations," Mr. Plouffe said.

For example, students of Pontiac County who normally have high marks in English received unusually low marks in that particular subject in one case, a mark of 91 percent had been reduced to 63.

Thirty teachers have studied the examinations and are to send a report to the board which already has corrected most of the errors.

The Outaouais school region is in western Quebec.

Newfoundland Will Get 1st Steel Mill

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—A 60,000-ton a year steel mill, the first in Newfoundland, is to be built at Octagon Pond, eight miles west of here, Premier Smallwood has announced.

Mr. Smallwood said the Newfoundland government will guarantee a bond issue at \$2,600,000 to help finance the \$3,600,000 project. The owners of the enterprise will raise \$300,000 and the federal government as an assistance to industry grant.

Promoters of the venture are John Miller, Gamma Engineering Ltd., Whitby, Ont., John McCormack Blades Ltd., Whitby, Ont., C.A. Pippy Newfoundland Tractor and Equipment Ltd. St. John's, Arthur R. Lundrigan, Corner Brook, Nfld., and Albert Martin, Corner Brook.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

You are "South" both sides vulnerable. The bidding has been:

East South West North
1 ♦ 4 ♠ 1 ♠ 1 ♠
2 ♠ 3 ♠ 3 ♠ 3 ♠
3 ♠ 4 ♠ 4 ♠ 4 ♠

What would you bid now with each of the following four hands?

- ♠ A Q 3 ♠ A K J 7 ♦ 4 2 ♣ Q 8 2
- ♠ Q 4 ♠ A Q 8 3 ♠ A Q ♠ K J 9 8 4
- ♠ A Q 5 2 ♠ A Q 6 4 ♠ 7 ♠ A Q 8 3
- ♠ A 4 2 ♠ A Q J 9 ♠ 9 ♠ K Q J 7 6 2

1. Two spades. There is no assurance that partner has any values and the most we can do at this point is give a single raise, indicating spade support and values somewhat in excess of a minimum double. North cannot have a really good hand, since he presumably would have jumped to two spades in such a case.

He may have six or seven points and a spade suit, but then again, he may have only one or two. It is not up to us to guess what he has; all that we need to do is identify our hand as accurately as possible by combining the double with a raise.

2. One notrump. The choice lies between one notrump and two clubs. The notrump bid is slightly better because it is more likely to induce a further bid from North. Partner might decide to pass two clubs, thinking the chances of an eleven
