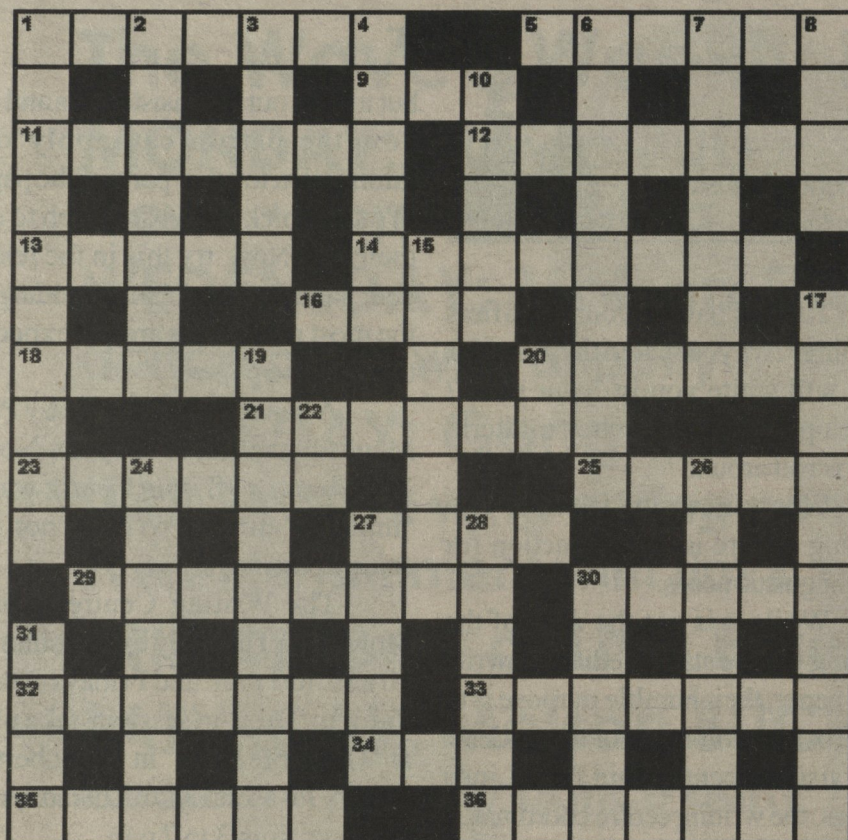

## Answer
