Milk Product
Okay In Canada

OTTAWA (CP) - Food and
drug officials are satisfied that
a reported contamination of the
dry milk product Starlac is
confined to the United States.

Discovery of salmonella or-
ganisms in samples has led to
recall of Starlac from the
shelves of 67,000 retail stores in
the U.S.

Borden Food Co., which pro-
duces Starlac both in the U.S.
and Canada, does not import
the product into this country.
Dr. R. A. Chapman, director of
the federal food and drug direc-
torate, said here.

He said the directorate's rou-
tine tests for micro-organisms
of all kinds have turned up no
evidence of salmonella in Star-
lac or any other milk powder.
Nor have there been any re-
ports of poisonings.

The salmonella organism pro-
duces gastro-intestinal infection
which can have serious conse-
quences.

In Toronto, a Borden com-
pany official said Canadian-made
Starlac is safe for consumption
and is not being recalled.

Mills Martz, vice president of
the Canadian subsidiary of the
company, said: "There is no
connection with the American
product. Ours is manufactured
in Canada from Canada-pro-
duced milk."

Special Labor Force Study
Says Immigrants Try Harder

OTTAWA (CP) - Immigrants
try harder than native-born Ca-
nadians to stay in school and to
hold a job, suggests a special
labor force study by the Do-
minion Bureau of Statistics.

The conclusions follow a sur-
vey of educational levels among
workers made by DBS in Feb-
ruary, 1965, and published Wed-
nesday.

Among male postwar immi-
grants aged 20 to 24, 60 per
cent of those with high school
educations still were going to
classes at the university level.

Of native Canadians in the
same age bracket and at the
same education level, 82 per
cent had stayed in the educa-
tion system.

Apart from this tendency,
more immigrants on the aver-
age have a secondary education
than Canadians because of se-
lective immigration policies.

The study also analyzed the
extent to which immigrants and
native Canadians older than 24
enter the labor force to take
jobs.
