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Youngest Victim Of Collision Dies In Boston

BOSTON, (AP) — Four-year-old Norma de Sandro, the youngest victim of the collision between the Andrea Doria and Stockholm, died Friday night in hospital.

The pretty, dark-haired little girl succumbed without regaining consciousness from a skull fracture suffered in the collision off Nantucket Island late Wednesday night.

Only a few hours before she had shown "some slight response." She underwent a brain operation Thursday night.

An Italian-speaking priest from the cathedral's Roman Catholic community broke the news of the child's death to her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Turio de Sandro of Milan.

The couple, whose dreams of a happy life in the United States with their daughter were shattered, received the news in a hospital room across the corridor from that of little Norma's.

They had suffered through a long rescue trip to New York aboard the French liner Ile de France after they were taken from the Andrea Doria without knowing whether their daughter was dead or alive.
