

Religious Notes.

The Catholic clergy in Missouri are lending their influence to the enforcement of the new high license law.

There are in Great Britain from six to eight thousand families of gypsies or other nomads, most of whom are as heathenish as the people to whom churches send missionaries.

During the century just passed the population of the United States has increased eleven-fold and while 100 years ago there was one church to every 1,700 inhabitants, there is now one to every 250.

The Archbishop of Canterbury has recently undertaken to revive the itinerant ministry by the ordination of special clergy to engage in the work of going from place to place to stir up the churches by extraordinary efforts, and to bring in the non-church-goers, who form so considerable a part of the population.

A young man who had heard a sermon with which he seemed to be well satisfied, gave as a reason, "I liked this morning's sermon, because it seemed to come right out of the preacher's experience without effort, and without any consciousness of himself or any care for what his audience thought of either him or his discourse."

Prof. Francis W. Newman, brother of the Cardinal, has been elected an honorary fellow of Trinity College, Oxford. It is remarkable that the two brothers, reared by a pious mother, and educated in the same university, should both have departed from their early training and gone in diametrically opposite directions. They took their tickets on the same Oxford platform, but one went north, the other south. That Oxford should half a century after recall them both by honorary fellowship is a significant symptom of the intellectual tendencies of the age.
