**NEWER PARK**

It offers a swimming pool, trailer park, canteen service, showers, amusement pavilion, salt water bathing, and a magnificent panorama of Northumberland Strait. **BIRD SANCTUARY**

One of the places on most visitors itineraries is Moore's Sanctuary at Milltown which is home to literally thousands of wild fowl during the migration seasons. A number of the majestic Canada geese, black ducks and mallards may be seen there the year round; and many photos testify to the ease with which Brent Moore, who was trained by his father, Harvey Moore, call the birds to be fed by hand.

An old sandstone and brick building in the town of Montague is the home of the provincial museum. A project of the local Junior Chamber of Commerce, it began as a farm museum and has now developed into many other fields. Much Island history can be traced through the many and rare items which have been donated by generous residents from as far west as Alberta.

**COLORFUL REGATTA**

A colorful event held each year in mid-July which is enjoyed by all boat men.
