44 Records Are Shattered; Olympic Outlook Brighter

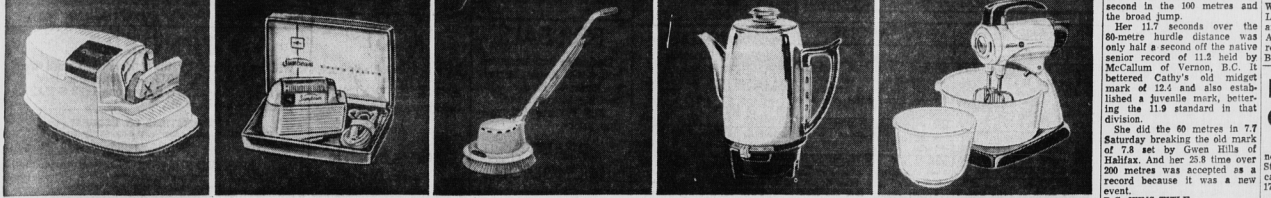

Pennel Tops Own Record

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—John Pennel, the Northeast Louisiana State College senior who became the first man to pole vault 17 feet has done it twice.

Pennel, rocketed over the crossbar at 17 feet, three-quarter inches in the Florida Gold Coast AAU track and field championships Saturday and officials said they felt certain the performance would stand as a world record.

The 25-year-old Miami's record-shattering effort broke his own world mark of 16 feet, 10 1/4 inches established in London Aug. 5.
