

# Role Of Dr. Donald MacRae In Founding Of Rotary Told

Playing down his own part in the founding of the Charlottetown Rotary Club and Rotary International, the Hon. C. J. Burchell, P.C. told Rotarians of his association with the late Dr. Donald A. MacRae, a native of Conroy Cove, P.E.I., who when Dean of Law at Dalhousie, came over with Burchell to organize Rotary in Charlottetown, in September, 1917.

Speaking of the international object of Rotary, "He was the man," said Mr. Burchell, "who first conceived and drafted this object and moved its adoption at the annual Rotary conference held in Edinburgh in the year 1921 where it was unanimously adopted by the Rotarians present at that convention."

In 1920 at Atlantic City Burchell was appointed to a small committee to prepare a resolution

which would form the basis of a constitution for Rotary. He induced the committee to have MacRae draft the resolution. "The resolution, as drafted by MacRae, which was unanimously adopted by the Convention, without objection from any of the delegates, contained eighteen paragraphs. It is interesting to note that after a lapse of 36 years the principle of every paragraph is now embodied in the present constitution of Rotary International."

MacRae and the committee were careful in particular to provide that there would be no room in the proposed constitution for the establishment of national organizations in any country.

The president of Rotary at the 1920 Atlantic City convention was so pleased with MacRae's work that he had him appointed to

draft a new constitution based on the resolution.

INTERNATIONAL

In the course of doing so MacRae proposed the Object "The advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional men united in the ideal of service."

MacRae attended the 1921 Edinburgh convention and moved that the draft constitution be not adopted but considered by a committee of 21. This was done and the committee adopted and followed MacRae's draft with only minor alterations. It was approved at the convention at San Francisco.

The committee of 21 did change the term of directors from MacRae's proposed 2-year term to one year. It is only in the past four or five years that the constitution was changed to a 2-year period, "which, I think," said Mr. Burchell, "is the more sensible plan as one year is not sufficient time to enable a new director to be of much assistance in the development of Rotary."

MacRae received a letter addressed to Dr. MacRae on Jan. 28, 1955, a few months before his death, by Herbert J. Taylor, thanking him on the occasion of the Golden Anniversary of Rotary for "starting Rotarians on the path which has led to one of Rotary's greatest achievements—the development of international understanding and goodwill."

At St. Louis in 1923 MacRae opposed a resolution that Rotary International should take over the entire work of the Crippled Children's Society of America. In its place was adopted the resolution that Rotary Clubs should not devote their energies entirely to any community work but should support all existing agencies or, if no suitable agency existed, to create an agency or otherwise initiate a community venture and give it support.

## C.W.I.L. Regional Conference Is Held At Corran Ban Sunday

Mrs. L.L. Noonan, a former provincial president, presided at the first regional conference of the Catholic Women's League, held at Corran Ban Sunday afternoon, November 18th. A hearty welcome was extended to the delegates by Rev. Father Wood, parish priest of Corran Ban and Covehead and by the President of the Corran Ban Sub-division, Mrs. Aeneas Mac Dougal. Mrs. Hansman was born near Oslo in Norway on Nov. 7, 1859. She has five sons, one daughter, 13 grandchildren, 20 great-grandchildren and one great-great-grandchild.

She lives with her daughter, Mrs. Bertha Luna, who assisted her during the interview.

The nonagenarian answered questions in a full, even voice and seemed unperturbed by the flashing bulbs of a news camera.

LIKES TO REST

Mrs. Luna said her mother spends her days resting, getting up for meals, occasional visits by old friends and "dreaming of the old times."

Her 97th birthday was marked simply. Rising at 10 a.m., Mrs. Hansman had breakfast and then waited patiently for reporters and photographers.

Following the interview she retired and got up again between 2 and 3 p.m. for lunch and a short visit from several old friends and relatives.

Emigrating with her parents to Iowa when she was seven, Mrs. Hansman was married in 1880. With her husband, a carpenter and farmer, she lived for some time in Ledgerwood, N.D., then moved to Canada in 1906.

The couple homesteaded north of Cadogan, in central Alberta near the Saskatchewan boundary, until 1916 when her husband died. Soon after she moved to Provost.
