## Cardinal Gibbons' Visit Delighted With the Country. A RED LETTER DAY.

SUNDAY, the 31st ult., was a day long to be remembered by the parish of Vernon River. During the course of the preceding week His Eminence Cardinal Gibbons, Archbishop of Baltimore, condescended to honor Rev. Dr. Doyle with his distinguished visit. His Eminence was accompanied by Rev. T. J. Broderick, pastor of St. Martin's, Baltimore, an old acquaintance and friend of the most popular pastor of Vernon River. The Cardinal expressed himself during the week as delighted with the beauty of the surroundings of the really delightful parish and vicinity of Vernon River. Trout fishing, promenade and driving were the pleasurable amusements innocently indulged in during the course of last week. His Eminence was successful in catching some trout at Mullins' mill. But Sunday last, as untimated, was the day of days—a red letter for Vernon River. High mass was chanted, Coram Eminetissimo by the choir of the parish, a clergyman of the diocese kindly consenting to lead. The Rev. pastor of St. Martin's, T. J. Broderick, was the celebrant. "In Solemnibus" was sung in good style. "Jesu dulcis memoria" was sweetly sung at the offertory. The distinguished visitor, His Eminence Cardinal Gibbons, addressed the vast multitude assembled in the Vernon River Church on the estate of the day. There were not less than 1,200 people present. His Eminence pronounced a practical discourse on the dignity and grandeur of being a Christian. The people of God in days of old addressed by the name as Lord, Master, and called Him by the name of Jehovah, and Judge. As St. Paul intimated, His followers were privileged to address God as Abba, or Father. If we are children of God, sons of God in name and reality, then we are brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ. His Eminence then demonstrated the love of Jesus for his brothers and sisters, notwithstanding that some had caused the divine cheek of Jesus to be suffused with shame on account of their disgraceful conduct. He showed the difference between the treatment of man actuated by merely human natural motives, sentiments of revenge, unkind, unbrotherlike feelings towards his fellow man, and the mild and kind treatment of Jesus Christ, who never once forgot that He had come down upon earth to be similar to man in everything except sin, and always remembered man was His chosen brother. Witness the betrayal of Judas, the abandonment of the Apostles. What did Jesus? After His Resurrection, when He ascended into Heaven, He told them He was going to "my God and your God, to my Father and your Father." Witness the tenderness of the tears of Jesus at the tomb of Lazarus. Abraham Lincoln, of the United States, is justly praised for having signed the document which made free-born men of thousands of slaves, but see what Jesus did. He signed with His precious blood the decree of man's freedom from the fetters which held him bound to eternal slavery. Jesus left His Gospel a message of peace and love—the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Not much change in the general condition of the market. Large cod in light supply and firm. Bbl. herring dull. Box herring have a firmer tendency. Receipts of mackerel are increasing and prices are lower.

POTATOES—There was a short supply on Friday and best stock sold up to \$2.50. Monday and Tuesday there was a full supply again with best Virginia at \$2 and Bristol Ferry at \$2.25. Yesterday there was a further decline and at the close best Virginia are hard to place at over \$1.75 and \$2.00 is about top for Bristol Ferry stock. Some of the Va. stock is poor and in bad order and has to be sold for what it will bring. Small lots of native potatoes are beginning to come in but the indications are that this crop will be light.

EGGS—Receipts have been pretty full, weather extremely hot and demand slack. Strictly choice fresh Michigan, provincial and western hold fairly steady, but there are a good many more or less defective that have to be sold at easy prices, and such are extremely hard to place. Eastern extras in limited supply. Provincial, choice fresh are quoted at 17¢ per doz.
