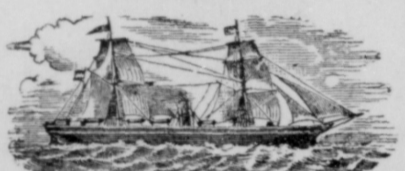

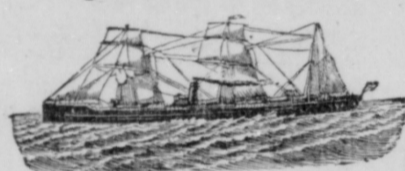
HALIFAX AND CHARLOTTETOWN

Of Special Interest to our Farmers

Clover Hay.

Be careful about it; try and get it in just right.

Do not start in and cut unless you feel sure that the weather will be good for forty-eight hours or longer.

Study the weather reports; have a barometer and watch its indications.

Then if you see clear sky ahead cut a big lot down and prepare to fill your mow, cutting in the afternoon; the next morning shake out the bunches; in the afternoon rake into large windrows. Try and rake so that the butts will be exposed to the dews of the second night.

The next day by ten or eleven, fork into heaps and let stand a little while to warm up; then all hands to work hauling.

This will give you good, sweet hay worth twice as much as the rain and dew-stained and sun-dried stuff so common on Peter Tumbledown's farm. Farm Journal.

Keeping up the Quality.

It is a very difficult matter to keep up the quality of the poultry when the policy is pursued of selling or killing and eating the best fowls, and breeding from what is left. This is a sure way of degeneracy, says the Co-operative Farmer, and yet it is one found on many farms. The desire grows for fried chicken as the day approaches, and that desire is sometimes so intense that it calls for the largest and the best chicks to fill the bill. The lot is looked over from time to time as the picnics and celebrations go by, and when the basket meeting comes along the last of the best chicks are fried and taken to the basket meeting. This is kept up in this manner until the time comes for selling what is not desired to be kept over, and the henhouse is invaded in the night with lantern in hand to get some of the "best early markets" to take to town to sell. A coopful of the best are selected and sold. The culls are left on the farm and constitute the breeding stock for another year. This is practised on some farms year in and year out, and the grading which is done is downward instead of upward.

It is very plain to be seen what the ultimate result of such a practise must be. It is also quite apparent what the result would be if the number of breeding birds should be selected first of the best of the flock, and the remaining ones sold what they will bring. The best should be kept and bred, and if this practice be followed for years there will be a sure improvement in the quality. Just as sure as like begets like, just so sure will this be the result. If you are at the head of the procession that is going the wrong way, you will fall out by the wayside.

Two Experiments Suggested

The Farmer's Advocate reminds its readers of two practical experiments that may easily be tried this season. One refers to the use of salt on mangels, and the other to the killing of wild mustard, where the weed pest has obtained a foothold, by spraying with sulphate of copper or iron.

1st—Salt for mangels: Not more than four or five cwt. per acre, sown broadcast before thinning. One of our readers secured good results by

applying 250 lbs. per acre last season. Apply over certain number of rows, leaving an equal area untreated. Compare the respective yields by weights or measure.

2nd—Sulphate of iron or copper on mustard: Spray when the leaves are most conspicuous, before the plant begins to flower and when the grain has not grown above it. Both chemicals appear to have been tried successfully in England. Sulphate of iron (copperas) is much cheaper than sulphate of copper (bluestone). Good results are reported from spraying at the rate of 50 gallons per acre, of a 7 1/2 per cent. solution of the former and at 2 per cent. solution of the latter. A 2 per cent. solution means, for example, 2 pounds dissolved in 98 lbs. of water, making 100 gallons solution. Spray one land and leave an adjoining one, where the weed is equally bad, untreated.

Quality Sacrificed to Size.

Says an exchange: Too much attention is being given to size of fruit. Strawberries are grown of mammoth size, and every year some new variety is brought out, for which it is claimed that it "excels all others in size." In the meantime there is a sacrifice of flavor and quality. Fruit growers who ship strawberries to market prefer a variety that will stand shipment well, but for home use it should be the object to grow the varieties of the best quality, making size secondary. But few varieties equal the flavor of the kinds which are small as a rule.
