**Dies In U.S.**

Of interest to many friends in this Province is the following "In Memoriam" published recently in the "Standard Times" of New Bedford.

Private funeral services were held at 3 p. m. today for Franklin E. Smith, 80, inventor of a flax-fiber processing method in textiles, who died Thursday at the residence of his sister, Miss Maude H. Smith, 35 Pleasant

Street, South Dartmouth.

A native of Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, Mr. Smith lived in this country before going to England where he spent 35 years, returning in 1912 to make a permanent residence here. Mr. Smith had been active in the textile industry during his life. For eight years he was an engineer with the Mason Machine Company in Taunton, in England he served on the advisory panel of the Department of Overseas Trade and on the Overseas Trade Development Council of His Majesty's Board of Trade, London.
