New York Stocks

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market spent most of its time in a depressed condition Monday with a rally just before the close. The recovery try was led by the railroads, but it was far from being effective. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks added 10 cents and stood at \$110.30. The industrial component of the average was down 30 cents, but that decline was over-balanced by a gain of 50 cents in the railroads and a gain of 10 cents in the utilities. Volume at 1,080,000 shares was equal to the second-lowest total of the year.

Higher were New York Central, Southern Railway U. S. Gypsum, Western Union, Homestake Mining, Du Pont, and Phibro. Lower were Illinois Central, Texas Co., 20th Century-Fox, International Telephone, American Smelting, Allied Chemical, Westinghouse Electric, Bethlehem Steel, Good-year, Montgomery Ward, Boeing and Zenith.

Canadian stocks were lower: International Nickel and Dome Mines each slipped 1-8. McIntyre and Inram Walker both dropped 30 cents, but that decline was over-balanced by a gain of 50 cents in the railroads and a gain of 10 cents in the utilities.
