Local and Other Items.

THE PRIZE RING.—The fight between James J Corbett and "Kid" McCoy has been called off. McCoy is now matched with Peter Maher for a prize of \$10,000 and a division of the gate receipts.

POTATOES ROTTING.—The Amherst Press says: Reports from all over the lower province are to the effect that the potatoes, both those in the ground and in the cellars are rotting badly. On the north shore of Westmorland the French crop is said to be below the average, and the tubers are rotting.

THE WARD SYSTEM.—Stratford, Ont has now definitely followed the lead of several other Ontario towns and cities in abolishing the ward system. A recommendation for the reform was passed at the last City Council meeting and a by-law will be submitted to the ratepayers at the municipal meeting next January asking them to ratify election the action of the Council

FOUGHT WITH WELLINGTON.—The death occurred recently at Easton, Me., of John McDougall who was baptiz'd at Dumfries, Scotland, Sept. 26, 1794, making his age 104. Among his papers was an honorable discharge from the British army, dated October 12, 1815. He served under Wellington in the peninsula, and was for 95 years a resident of Moncton, leaving there about ten years ago to live with a married daughter.

GETTING DOWN TO FIGURES.—The steamer Fastnet has arrived at Vancouver from Skagway. She bears half a million in gold dust and news that a million more is coming. The principal owners of the gold are H M Kersey, general manager of the Yukon Steamship Co., \$50,000 in nuggets for exhibition purposes; J B Rhodes, of Portland, \$60,000 in dust; W Caldwell, of Portland, \$80,000 in dust; Edward Leeson, \$100,000 in dust; J Sinclair, of Vancouver, \$25,000 in dust.

NEWS NOTES

The Japanese are curiously alike physically. Recent measurements taken of an infantry regiment showed no variation except two inches in height or 20 pounds in weight.

There is general complaint among British merchants of the unsatisfactory state of trade with China, because of the disturbances there. Recent cablegrams from the commercial centres, as well as from other districts, in China, are far from encouraging.

At a meeting of prominent citizens, held at the Russell House, in Ottawa, and presided over by Mr. E. Berkeley Powell, M. L. A., it was resolved to request His Excellency the Governor-General to accept a farewell banquet from the citizens. The date will be left to His Excellency to appoint, and the Chief Justice of Canada will preside at the dinner.

In a signed interview regarding the recent disturbances near Peking, Ho Yow, the Chinese Consul at San Francisco said: "I believe that the recent trouble in China is due to religion; to efforts of the missionaries to carry on their work, and the antagonistic relations existing between the Chinese who still cling to their faith of centuries past and those who have adopted the ideas of the Christian religion. I do not think it will result seriously, owing to the fact that there is a lack of co-operation."

The trouble with the Indians on the Minnesota reservation has cost some lives and may cost more before it is ended. It is but a little matter, however, compared with what the past used to produce. In the '60's the Sioux swept a large part of Minnesota clear of settlers and put back the progress of the state ten years. When the punishment was finally over there were not so many Indians to make trouble as when the business began. The Walker incident will only recall in a mild way what real Indian risings were.
