"Yes," he smiled, "I thought so. And I never spell 'K-i-r-e-n' on Monday. I have work to do."

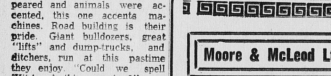
Small machines assembled in the chosen spot, the morning blessed him. The sun was a warm on his head, one day in his hair, clean and new.
