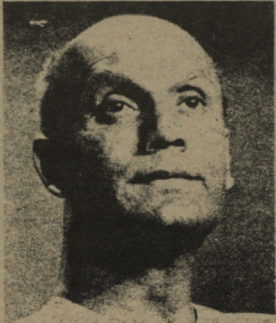

Sri Chinmoy

Sri Chinmoy was born in Bengal, India in 1931. At the age of twelve he entered an ashram, or spiritual community, and spent the next twenty years in prayer and meditation. During this period he had a number of deep mystical experiences, which he has sought to express through art, literature and music. Since coming to the West in 1964, Sri Chinmoy has written more than 300 books of spiritual poetry, plays, stories, aphorism, essays and questions and answers. He has done 127,000 paintings, which have been exhibited in museums, galleries and individual shows in the

U.S. and abroad, and composed 2,000 songs and instrumental works.

Sri Chinmoy is also head of an international spiritual organization with Centres throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, Australia, New Zealand, Latin America and Japan. He has lectured at major universities around the world, and frequently delivers talks at the United Nations. In 1970 he was invited to become Director Of the United Nations Medation Group and since then has been working to bring a new spiritual dimension to the quest for world peace through his twice-weekly medations for U.N. delegates, representatives and staff.

There will be a display of Sri Chinmoy works, along with slides, at the Robertson Library, Friday January 20, 1978, from 11:00 -3:00 p.m. There will be no charge for this event.
