NEW YORK, Aug. 30—(AP)—Joe Louis has convinced himself that he and rare old wine have something in common. Both improve with age.

"I think I'm better now than at any time since the war," said the Brown Bomber, here today en route to his Pompton Lakes, N.J., camp where he will complete training for his Sept. 27 bout with Ezzard Charles at Yankee Stadium.

"I weigh 218 now," he continued, "and expect to come in for the fight between 214 and 217." Louis weighed 215 for the second fight with Jersey Joe Walcott, his "positively last appearance."

"It's easier getting in shape this time," Joe added. "When I came back from the war I weighed 235 and had to train down for the Billy Conn fight. I'm taking it easier this time."

"I've fought 55 exhibitions, including seven 10-rounders, and when I went to West Baden for preliminary training I weighed only 223."
