

Island Crusade Plans Said Near Completion

With the opening date of the Island Billy Graham Crusade less than two weeks away, plans are rapidly being finalized by the local committee.

Evangelist Joe Blinco, who conducts the crusade in Charlottetown from Sunday, June 7 to 13 is expected in the city next weekend.

Since he entered full-time evangelistic work at the age of 20, Mr. Blinco has become firmly convinced that mass evangelism is one of the important means through which God exercises his saving power.

Thoroughly committed to the cause of evangelism, Mr. Blinco accepted Dr. Graham's invitation to join his Evangelistic Team as an associate evangelist in 1955 and looking back, he has said repeatedly that he regards his years of association with the team as the most rewarding and blessed years of his entire ministry.

Dr. Graham, who is presently scheduled to arrive in the city on the morning of June 14, is said to have preached to more persons than any other living person.

He is a man who has put his entire life, body, mind and spirit in the hands of the God whom he serves. He believes he is doing what God called him to do, and what anyone else thinks about it is totally irrelevant.

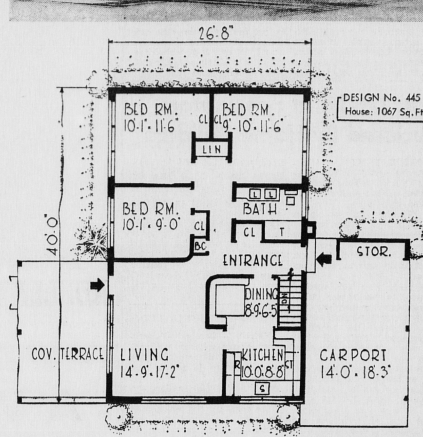
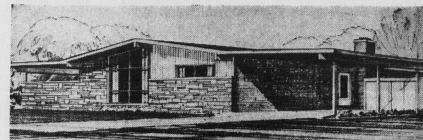

Home Building Down Sharply

HALIFAX (CP) — Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation says the residential construction industry in the Atlantic provinces has fallen off 23 per cent so far this year from last.

CMHC says in its monthly report, that the dropping trend follows several years of record-setting activity in the four provinces.

The slow-down became evident in Nova Scotia in April, the report says. The lower trend became more pronounced in Newfoundland, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island in May.

Increased activity was reported in Industrial Cape Breton, with more construction this year than in 1963 in New Waterford and Glace Bay. Factory head steady.

Also showing increases were Truro, Dartmouth, N.S., Campbellton, N.B., Smeads Parish N.B., and St. John's, Gander and Freestwater Bay in Newfoundland.

The number of homes under construction in the Atlantic provinces at the end of April stood at 1705, down from 2,502 a year earlier.
