

**Locomotive
To Become
Attraction**

VICTORIA (CP)—Some people have fairies at the bottom of their garden. Len Hutton has a locomotive.

Mr. Hutton, who has spent 33 years driving every kind of steam engine—from farm tractor to locomotive—bought the 11-ton steam locomotive for old time's sake. He plans to turn it into a tourist attraction.

The 26-year-old behemoth was shipped here by sea from West Germany.

"Once I get her cleaned up and ready to go, she could be a popular attraction in one of our parks."

"She was built for use in surface mining but the mine closed in 1943 and the engine was retired after only seven years of use so she should be in good shape."

Mr. Hutton doesn't say how much the locomotive cost him, but he admits to spending \$1,150 in customs duties to bring it into Canada.

The engine runs on a two-foot-gauge track.

Mr. Hutton said he had his mind set on an engine in the United States but found it would have cost more to have that one shipped by land than cost to ship the German one by sea.

Mr. Hutton gained his first experience with steam engines aboard a threshing machine on his parents' farm near Prince Albert, Sask., in the early 1920s.

He has driven many steam engines since then and found the trickiest job was manoeuvring big locomotives at Ogden Point docks here.

"One miscalculation, and the whole engine could have gone into the drink."

**New Legion
Opens Officially**

MORELL — The Morell Branch of the Canadian Legion celebrated the opening of its newly renovated home recently by presenting awards to some of its members and by a social evening at which the branch treated over 60 members and visitors to a lobster boil.

For his usefulness in the service of the Legion, a life membership was presented to Edgar Mackenzie by the provincial president, Mercer Mullin. Past zone commanders badges were presented to Reg. MacAdam and John McInnis and a past branch president's badge was awarded to Walter Coe.

A badge awarded posthumously to William Geldert for five years as president and for devoted service to the branch was presented to Mrs. Geldert.

Pius Smith, provincial chairman of the membership committee presented a certificate to the branch in recognition of an increase of over six percent in membership during the past year. This brought the membership in the branch to 90. This is about 90 percent of the potential in the area served by the branch, it was stated.

Present from provincial command for the re-opening of the branch besides Mr. Mullin and Mr. Smith were Edwin Hoan, provincial secretary, Capt. A.C. MacEachern, honorary treasurer, and Harvey Poole, eastern Kings zone commander.

The branch spent \$5,000 to remodel and furnish their home with the main section on the ground floor and the lounge on the second floor. The third floor, which is unused at present, was offered to the scouts and guides.

Among other activities the Morell Branch and the Ladies Auxiliary recently sponsored a noon luncheon for the provincial cabinet which was holding a meeting in the village.

**Grivas Sees
Cyprus United
With Greece**

NICOSIA (AP) — Lt. Gen. George Grivas, former leader of the Greek underground on Cyprus, declared here union of the island and Greece "is our main aim". He predicted "it will not be very long before it is achieved."

"If other countries want to help us, we will accept such assistance," he said. "But even if other countries will not help us, we are in a position to go it ourselves."

The Turkish-Cypriot minority has denounced his recent return from self-exile in Greece, saying his aim is to carry out enosis — or union with Greece by wiping out Cypriots of Turkish descent. Greek-Cypriots outnumber Turkish-Cypriots four to one.

**Greek Surprised
By Martin View**

ATHENS (Reuters) — Greek Foreign Minister Stavros Kostasopoulos has expressed "great surprise" at a statement by Canadian External Affairs Minister Paul Martin in the House of Commons in Ottawa alleging "Greece had sent men and arms into Cyprus."

Kostasopoulos said: "I wonder where Mr. Martin got his information and I cannot understand why the Canadian foreign minister has not sought direct information from Greece inasmuch as the two countries are allies and have friendly relations."
