Mature And Part-time University Students.

A proposal to initiate a part-time student fee in the amount of \$5.00 per course per semester (maximum of \$10.00 per semester), beginning January 1989, was put to a motion and was passed by the Board of Governors on October 3rd, 1988.

MAPUS has procured a guaranteed and continuous source of funding providing a basis of which to better meet the needs and tap the potentials of mature and part-time students. It has

received recognition by the University's highest governing body, the Board of Governors, as a viable and responsible organization.

MAPUS's self-image as well as the image of the University of Prince Edward Island as supportive of Continuing Education is increased.

There are 812 part-time students and 324 full-time mature (24 yrs and over) students enrolled at the University of Prince Edward Island.

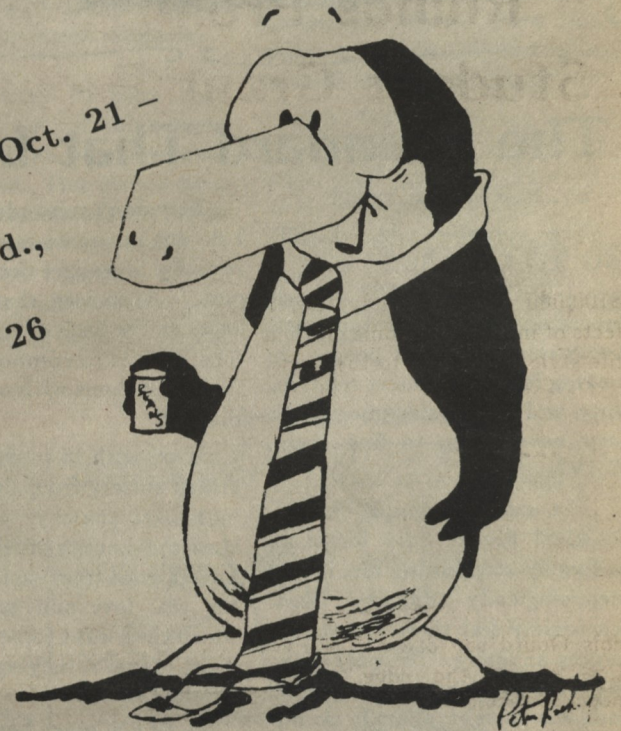
