WESTERN FRONT, Korea, July 23 (Wednesday)—(AP)—A tragic stream of wounded Allied soldiers down a shadowed, broken shell-blasted valley indicates the price in the continuing battle for a strategic hill—Old Baldy.

battle followed. The valley leading to the south-east slope of the hill is the last stop for ammunition and supplies and the first stop for the wounded. Communist shells burst through the length of the valley, a target second only to Old Baldy itself.

Wounded men are carried along the valley's cratered road to sand-bagged medical station. The aid station offers blood plasma and hope—but not much more.

Shelling Delays Wounded

Often the Communist shellfire is so heavy the stream of wounded is halted for hours. Men lie in holes at the base of the hill waiting for help that cannot come until the barrage lifts.

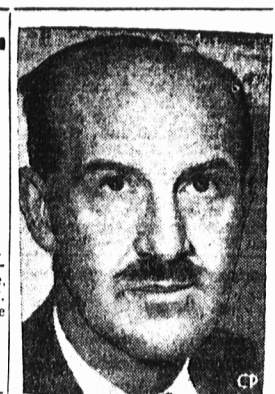
