FLOODS IN BRITISH COLUMBIA.

A despatch from Vancouver to the Star reports that the waters of the Fraser River were on Monday last higher by two feet than during the terrible floods of last June. Had weather, seventy in the shade, during the previous three days, brought down the snow from the mountains, swelling the unusually high tide. The chinook wind, whose peculiarity is to rush along the surface of the water, caught the swollen river and backed the water down over all the dykes, which withstood the force of the water, which was driven to the high knolls. The ranchers have been flooded out for the second time in six months. The Government is sending boats to rescue the cattle. Bridges hitherto untouched by the floods have been swept away and the roads destroyed. There is no communication between the suburban towns and the large cities. All the waters in British Columbia have gone beyond their bounds. In Vancouver the cellars of the whole city have been flooded and a great loss sustained for the first time in its history.
