### A HOTEL SYNDICATE.

Number of Hotels to be Erected in Canada.

### A Chance for Charlottetown.

MONTEAL, Jan. 6.—It is learned, on good authority that a large English syndicate proposes to erect a number of hotels at various ports in Canada, and that sites have already been secured in a number of localities for the erection of palace hotels which will be under one management and control. The syndicate will erect hotels at the following places: Halifax, Montreal, Ottawa, Toronto, and Niagara Falls, (Canada.)

### ECCLESIASTICAL CONFERENCE

The Pope's Encyclical to be Read Without Comment

In all but Exceptional Cases.

MONTEAL, Jan. 6.—The Ecclesiastical Conference has ended and the bishops have returned to their homes. It is understood that they simply discussed the Encyclical in an informal manner, deciding that the Encyclical be read without comment, unless an individual Archbishop wishes to give his clergy permission to make comments.

### SERIOUS FIRE AT OTTAWA.

Catholic University Badly Damaged.

OTTAWA, Jan. 6.—A serious fire occurred at the Ottawa Roman Catholic University yesterday. As a result the eastern wing was badly gutted and the beautiful structure badly damaged. The loss is \$40,000, covered by insurance.

OTTAWA, Jan. 6.—The National Art Gallery, which is in charge of Hon. Mr. Tarte's Department, was burglarized last night and a case of old coins of priceless value presented to the government many years ago by Colonel Falkland, was stolen. Some of the coins were over 2000 years old.

## THE GERMANS IN CHI NA

### Take a Lease at Kiao Chau.

BERLIN, Jan. 6.—The cession of Kiao Chau bay to Germany takes the form of a lease for an indefinite period. Germany is at liberty to erect on the ceded territory all the necessary buildings and establishments.

MONTEAL, Jan. 6.—The authorities of St. Vincent De Paul Penitentiary have decided to try drastic means to put a stop to the riotous conduct of the convicts, and as a result some twenty ringleaders will be flogged in presence of their fellows.

MONTEAL, Jan. 6.—Judge Jette confirms his appointment to the position of Lieutenant-Governor of Quebec to succeed Sir Adolphe Chapleau.

### CHURCH OF ST. ALBAN THE MARTYR.

An appropriate gift from the Hon. Fred Peters.

The Rev. James Simpson, officiated at the Church of St. Alban the Martyr, Souris, last Sunday. Morning Prayer and Evening-song were well attended. As there had been no church the previous Sunday, the service was appropriate to Christmas tide. The interior of the Church was handsomely decorated with evergreen. There were two mottoes, one over the chancel and extending across the church made of white letters on a scarlet background, and containing the Angelic salutation "Gloria to God in the Highest and on earth peace good will to men;" the other of a similar character back of the font being: "The Lord is our defence." The decorations were the work of Messrs John Pyke, Alexander Gillan and Goodwill Williams.

The choir was under the leadership of Prof. Marcon, who has been training it for the past four months. The Christmas hymn "Adeste Fidelis" was rendered in a creditable manner, Prof. Marcon and Miss Morrow being the soloists. The choir has greatly improved during the last year. Last January neither the canticles nor the "Gloria be to the Father" were sung while now both are chanted. Mr. Simpson acknowledged with thanks the receipt of a new pulpit, the gift of Hon. Frederick Peters. It is Anglican in design, and rests on an hexagonal base which narrows by appropriate mouldings to the stem which is made of plane panelling; this enlarges in a similar manner to an enclosed platform. Each face has an arched recessed panelling on which a cross and the letters I. H. S. are alternately placed. Suitable mouldings around the top, an adjustable desk and the steps complete the work. A brass plate, with the following inscription is to be placed on a base panel: "Presented to the Church of St. Alban the Martyr, in Commemoration of the Sixtieth Anniversary of the Reign of Victoria, Queen and Empress, by the Honorable Frederick Peters, Premier of Prince Edward Island." Messrs. Albert H. and William R. Dingwell of Souris were the contractors.

In addition to the above welcome gift the Church has been remembered among others by the following friends: Rev. T.H. Hunt presented a beautiful Communion Service book; the ladies of St. Peter's Cathedral, purple and green frontals for the altar; Captain William H. Jackson, G. A. R., of Boston, made generous contributions for various purposes; Mr. Fred. E. Morrow had the exterior of the Church painted; and Mr. Arthur Mellish gave a framed porch card in two colors containing the following sentence, "Whoever thou art who enterest this Church leave it not without one prayer to God for thyself, for those who minister and for those who worship here."
