BABIES TO GET STOCK

SKOKIE, Ill. (AP)—Each Saskatchewan baby born the day miners reach the world's largest high-grade potash reserve in that province will receive one share of common stock in the company developing the mine. International Minerals and Chemicals Corporation of Skokie said Friday it will award the stock valued at about \$27 a share. The stock has been paying an annual dividend of \$1.60. Company officials estimate the share will reach the \$40,000,000 reserve at Esterhazy, Sask. in early June.
