Fine, Suspension Handed Speeder

SUMMERSIDE — A chase through Summerside streets at speeds of up to 85 miles per hour resulted in a \$50 fine and a license suspension of three months to 16-year-old Gordon William Tombs of Summerside. Magistrate R.S. Hinton also recommended to the motor vehicle registrar that another nine months suspension be added. Three months is the maximum time a driver's license can be suspended under the act on this charge of driving without due care and attention.

Police Chief S.D. Wanaumaker told the court that Tombs and another unidentified youth were throwing fire crackers from their car at girls walking along the sidewalk. When the patrol car approached they sped away and managed to elude the patrol for a period of ten minutes or more as they careened around corners at very fast speeds.

Secrecy Run Afoul Of Commons' Rules

OTTAWA (CP)—The 30 Social Credit MPs—26 of them with no previous parliamentary experience—have run afoul of Commons rules repeatedly during the daily question period in this week-old Parliament.

The Social Crediters have fired scores of questions at the government on topics ranging from bilingualism to television reception in Bale St. Paul, Que. Most of the queries have been ruled out of order by Speaker Marcel Lambert, or have been dismissed by cabinet ministers as "improperly phrased."

At Thursday's sitting alone seven questions from the Social Credit group were ruled out of order, including one by leader Robert Thompson. Five were rejected by ministers.

This trend has been accelerated by Speaker Lambert, who "Corrago" (Marie) in California. Parliamentary arrangements have not been completed.
