Contract Bridge

A COSTLY DOUBLE

There have probably been more expensive doubles than East made in today's deal, but his was had enough!

North dealer.
North-South vulnerable.

♠ K J	♥ 7 5 4
♦ A K 9 8 7 3	♣ 10 8 5
♠ A K Q 6	♥ 10 8 5
♦ A	♣ K 4 3 2

The bidding:

North	East	South	West
2♣	Pass	2♠	Pass
3♦	Pass	3♥	Pass
4NT	Pass	5♣	Pass
7♦	Dbl. (!) Pass	Pass	Pass
7♣	Dbl. (!) Pass	Pass	Pass

Beyond doubt, North was too optimistic when he went to seven hearts, but this action was infinitely better than the double East made! True enough, East had every right to feel that he would take a heart trick against the seven-heart contract—but that was a good reason for not doubling! Surely, there is very little logic in striving for an extra 100 points, when the effort may cost 20 or 30 times that much if it goes wrong!

This was a case in which the double most decidedly did go wrong! North, convinced that East had the guarded queen of hearts, took a more or less desperate "stab" at seven spades—and with remarkable success! East's double of that contract was probably pure pique!

If West had led anything but a club, South would have had easy sailing, but on the actual club lead, with an entry removed from dummy, South had to be careful and ingenious. He ran three diamonds, discarding a heart, ruffed dummy's last diamond, then ruffed a low club with the spade jack. He then overtook the spade king with the ace and ran every trump. When the last trump was played, East had the very unpleasant choice of giving up the club king, thus permitting South to cash the club queen, or discarding a heart and letting South win the necessary tricks in that suit.

Thus, instead of going down 100 (undoubled) at seven hearts, South made seven spades doubled, for 2670 points!




