Despite strong gales a volunteer bucket brigade and the Tignish and Alberton fire brigades prevented the flames from spreading to a garage only a few feet from the burning house from where the conflagration could have spread in line with the wind.

Closing Of Montague Rink Is Seen Likely By League

Following a special meeting of the Montague Community Welfare League last night it was announced that, in all probability, the Montague skating rink will not be open next winter.

membership is open to all citizens of Montague and vicinity the membership now totals only 13 and only six members attended last night's meeting. A letter pledging support to the league was received from Mayor Bruce H. Yeo who was out of the province on business. The executive reported that, before the rink could be operated for another season, major repairs would have to be made to the building and a new heating system for the dressing rooms installed.

This would entail an outlay of approximately \$2,500 one which the welfare league cannot afford without some visible means of additional revenue in the future. The only apparent ways of increasing the revenue of the rink are by enlarging the number of active welfare league members and by soliciting contributions from interested organizations and citizens of Montague and vicinity. It was also suggested that the rink should be leased for the summer and fall months as a means of raising some revenue. All the members present expressed themselves as being very reluctant to deprive the children of this source of recreation and training but could see no alternative to closing the rink unless the parents take an active personal interest in the operation of the rink. A later meeting will be held to make a final decision on the matter.

Navy Minesweepers Dock At Summerside

SUMMERSIDE — Three navy minesweepers, Resolute, Quinte, and Flamingo, part of the 1st Minesweeping Squadron, arrived at Summerside early yesterday afternoon on a two-day courtesy call while enroute from Montreal to their home port of Halifax. Shortly after the ships docked, exchange calls were made by the ships' commanding officers at the office of Mayor W.A. Currie, and with Group Captain J.E. Creeper, commanding officer of RCAF Station, Summerside. A number of invited guests attended a reception on board the ships at 6 p.m., and later in the evening navy officers were guests of the town at a civic reception at the Summerside Golf and Country Club. This afternoon the public have been invited to visit and inspect the ships between 1.30-4 p.m. and to precede a dance for the sailors at the Summerside diner. The officers from the ships will motor to Charlottetown to attend an evening dance at the new naval barracks. The ships will leave Summerside on Saturday morning.

Fund Drive Plans Made

SUMMERSIDE — The Summerside branch of the P.E.I. Association of Retarded Children met in the auditorium last evening to complete the organization of their forthcoming campaign to raise funds. The president, J. Watson MacNaughton presided. Representatives from the various service clubs, and other interested organizations were present and enthusiastically joined in the discussion of the many important matters on the agenda. It was decided that the executive of the local association would head up the campaign which will commence the week of June 8th. The objective for the province is \$15,000. The executive consists of Mr. MacNaughton, Mrs. Walter Leard, vice-president and Mrs. Grant Traverse, secretary. For the drive, the town has been divided into nine sectors and a captain appointed for each. Volunteer canvassers will be supplied each captain from the various organizations. Already the campaign has met with considerable success as substantial contributions have been received by the local group which they find most heartening. The money will be used largely to pay for as well as to furnish and equip the summer camp for retarded children at Oyster Bed Bridge. It will also help finance the annual meeting of the Canadian Association for Retarded Children which will be held in Charlottetown in September.

SUMMERSIDE — Professional vaudeville will be brought in to perform each evening of the Summerside Lobster Carnival it was decided at last night's meeting of the overall committee held in the Civic Building. Chairman Roy Johnston presided. To help defray the cost of bringing in professional performers it was decided to charge an admission price of 25 cents to the stadium where the performances will be held and where the various industrial booths and other attractions will be located. A suggestion by Ross MacKenzie that space should be made available in the stadium for local handicraftsmen, where they could exhibit their work and perhaps do some actual work on their craft for the public to see, was well received. Mr. MacKenzie mentioned as examples, boat builders, a pottery maker, a fisherman making a net, etc. Carnival chairman Charles Hogan stated that Lobster Carnival signs had been posted at strategic points on the mainland and also that at present 42 floats have been promised by business firms and organizations for the mammoth parade.
