A SPLENDID PERFORMANCE

J. K. Emmett and Lottie Gilson
Score a Decided Success.

[Halifax Recorder.]

Manager Clarke has brought some well-known stars to Halifax during his career as theatrical manager, and last night gave our citizens an opportunity of seeing two such noted artists as J. K. Emmett and Lottie Gilson, who opened their season at the Academy of Music in "Fritz in a Mad House," to a very large audience, who thoroughly enjoyed the piece and the work of the company, and laughed until their sides ached with many of their amusing scenes.

Fritz in a Mad House might well be termed a comedy-drama, and at times is a farce comedy. There is an interesting plot of the father devoted to the daughter, who though not in society, and the mother who believes only in her son, who is abroad among the best people, but turns out that the daughter is the best after all. There are several pathetic scenes, but the piece for the most part is highly amusing, and is intended principally to introduce Mr. Emmett in his character of Fritz. Mr. Emmett's father made thousands in the character, which was introduced in a series of plays—Fritz in Ireland, Fritz in Prosperity, etc. Fritz in a Mad House was his last play and was taken up by his son, who sings the principal songs which made such a success for his late parent, including the Cuckoo Song, the Lullaby, Schmerder how you was, etc. Mr. Emmett follows closely in his father's footsteps, and gives a splendid conception of the role, and his dancing is a great feature.

The late Mr. Emmett, however, never had such an artist with him as Miss Lottie Gilson; she is known as one of the most popular serio-comic vocalists on the vaudeville stage in America or Europe, and has been such a favorite in New York that she has appeared at some theatres there for several months, and has been the highest salaried artiste before the public in her line. It was the first time a Halifax audience has had the pleasure of listening to her, and they received her with so much applause that she was compelled to ask not to demand so many encores; she has a way of singing that charms everybody; her enunciation is clear and distinct, and her expression and manner most magnetic. Among her songs were Jeany Jones, Military Mollie, the Iceman, Telephone, My Baby, and the Moth and the Flame.

The supporting company was all that could be desired, notably J. A. Nunn as Uncle Joe, who is one of the best actors we have ever seen here, and Miss Ida Lewis as Mrs. Parker. Bobby Beatrice is one of the cutest children seen on the stage.

There will be only two more performances of this piece, and Miss Gilson will introduce new songs nightly. It is one of the best attractions we have had, and should not be missed by anybody who can laugh or can enjoy popular songs.

Miss Lottie Gilson will sing the following songs tonight: Military Molly, The Girl I Loved in Sunny Tennessee, Jolly Jessie Jones, Mi Haana Lady, Little Willie.

SIR WILFRID'S RESIDENCE

Why the Party Didn't Chip in.

OTTAWA, July 13.—There is another side of the story in reference to the Laurier residence matter, which cropped in Parliament last week, that has so far not been made public. When Sir Wilfrid stated that he had been offered the house and refused it, he doubtless, for reasons of his own, did not state all the facts. It appears that last year, when the question of procuring a residence for the Premier at Ottawa was mooted, it was contemplated to make the present of the dwelling direct to Sir Wilfrid. Then some shrewd party man hit upon the device of procuring, not a permanent abode for Sir Wilfrid, but a manse for the Liberal leader for the time being, whoever he may happen to be. Mr. Dobell was chiefly instrumental in passing round the hat to get the requisite money to purchase a residence for Sir Wilfrid, and met with good success, but when the plan was changed, and it was decided to simply make Sir Wilfrid a tenant so long as he was leader, and that the house should be the property of the party, with Bate and Sons as trustees, many of the original subscribers would have nothing further to do with the affair. One prominent Liberal, who had promised Mr. Dobell a substantial subscription at first, refused point blank to countenance the new scheme when it was proposed to him.

A NEW BUTTER MACHINE

Handles 125 Gallons of Milk and takes Butter Direct From it.

A report to the Montreal Star states that there was recently exhibited at the Government Dairy School of Quebec a wonderful dairy invention the work of Mr. E. G. N. Salenians, of Stockholm. The Radiator butter-maker, which is a combined separator and churn is in operation there taking the butter directly out of the milk at the rate of 125 gallons of milk an hour. The process by which butter is produced directly from the milk in one continuous operation is explained at length and all questions clearly and courteously answered by Mr. E. Ohlen. There is also on exhibition a new butter press invented by Mr. Arthur Vaillancourt, of Montreal, which gives very general satisfaction.
