TORONTO (CP)—Prices declined in moderate trading on the Toronto Stock Exchange Tuesday. In the main, banks continued last week's advances and were up 1.73 to 147.17 on index from Monday.

Among other main industrials, Texaco was up 1/4 to 55 with Interprovincial Pipeline and Price Brothers increasing 1/4 to 85 1/2 and 40 1/2.

North Canadian Oil rose 15 cents to 4.30 among Western Oils and Banff 10 cents to 6.00. Canadian Export Gas dropped 12 cents at 56.

On the speculative side O'Brien slipped 32 cents to 1.58 and D'Elona 7 to 85 cents. On index, industrials were up .42 to 166.11, base metals .18 to 82.15, Western Oils 1.15 to 101.74 and the TSE 43 to 156.34. Goids up 56 to 157.85. Volume was 3,540,000 shares compared with 2,124,000.

Former Securities Director Committed To Stand Trial

TORONTO (CP)—John Campbell, former director of the Ontario Securities Commission, has been committed to stand trial on two counts of breach of trust by a public official.

The charges arose from transactions in Chesterville Mines Ltd. in May, 1964, and Windfall Oils and Mines Ltd. in July of the same year when Mr. Campbell was director of the commission.

He was suspended from the \$14,500 a year post by Attorney General Arthur Wishart in August, 1964, and resigned a month later. He was committed to trial.

Mr. Hess said Campbell's actions may have been "foolish, inept, even stupid" but that was not an offence under the Criminal Code.

In reference to Windfall, Mr. Hess said he had difficulty understanding the relationship the evidence bore to the charge.

He said Campbell went to great pains to see that Windfall wasn't suspended by the Toronto Stock Exchange in July while shares of the stock were soaring in price.

Said ACTION 'UNUSUAL' Campbell's activities, he said, had been described as "unusual" but they were the same as George Wardrop's, Ontario minister of mines. Additionally, Campbell had received a letter from Lt. Gen. Howard D. Gamm, president of the exchange, lauding Campbell for his efforts.
